Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy.”

Many thanks to Laura Bertone, Deacon Mark and Francesca Privitali who helped to shepherd the newly initiated group throughout this past year in the OCIA.

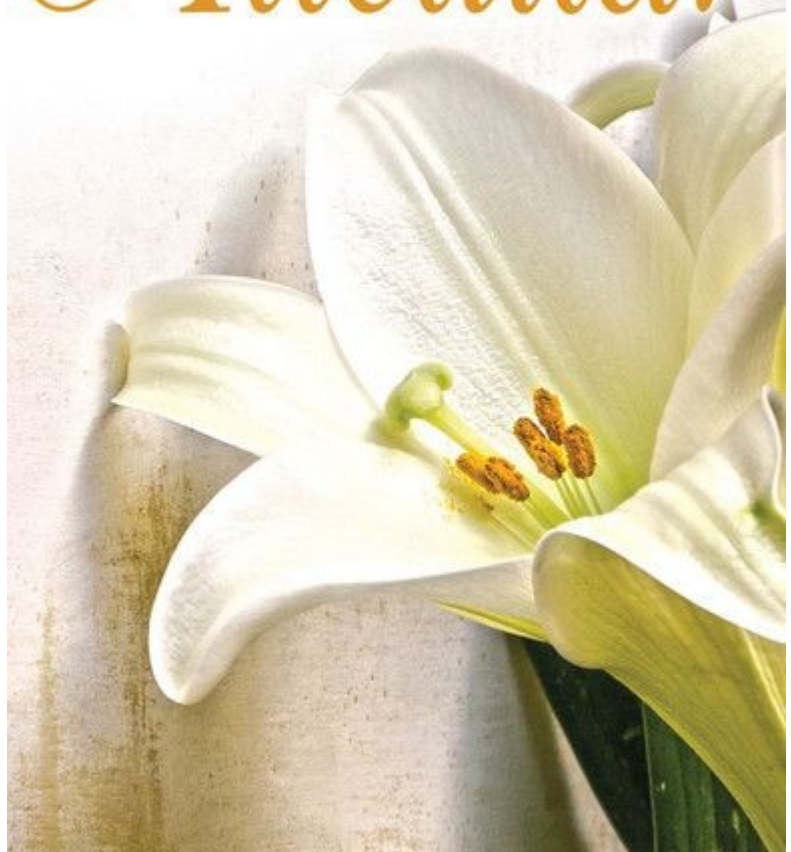
I also wish to thank each of you who came to worship with us so regularly. Your presence at Holy Mass was and is an inspiration to me and to those around you.

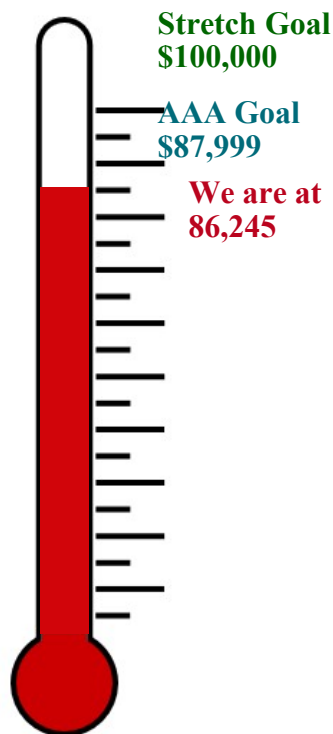
