# NOVEMBER 9, 2025 THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On this Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the Cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, who is the Pope. Though St. Peter's Basilica is more famous, it is the Lateran Basilica of St. John that is the mother and head of all churches in the world — a sign of unity for all Christians in communion with the successor of Peter. This feast is not simply about honoring a building of stone and marble, but about what that building represents: the living Church of God, built of living stones — that is, each one of us.

In the Gospel (John 2:13–22), Jesus drives the money changers from the Temple, declaring, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." He was speaking of the temple of His Body. In doing so, Jesus revealed that the true dwelling place of God is not in structures made by human hands, but in His own person, and through Him, in each one of us who are baptized into His Body. St. Paul reminds us in the second reading: "You are God's building... Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?" (1 Cor 3:9,16). What a beautiful and challenging truth! Every Christian community, every believer, is a living temple where God's presence should shine in holiness, love, and mercy.

As we celebrate this feast, we are called to renew our reverence for sacred places where we gather for worship — but even more, to renew our hearts, to cleanse them as Jesus cleansed the Temple, removing whatever keeps us from being true temples of God's presence. Let this feast remind us that the Church is not simply a building, but a people united in faith, rooted in Christ, and sent into the world to be signs of His love. The Lateran Basilica stands as a visible symbol of that unity — but it is in our lives that the living Church must be built each day.




