November 30, 2025 First Sunday of Advent

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

Today we begin a new liturgical year, and with it, the season of Advent. Advent is not only a time of preparation for Christmas—the celebration of Christ's birth—but also a reminder of His second coming and His coming into our lives every day.



The readings remind us of a single, urgent message: Be awake. Be ready. Be attentive. Not with fear, but with hopeful expectation. In the first reading, Isaiah gives us a picture of the future full of hope: He invites us to imagine a world where peace replaces violence, unity replaces division, and light overcomes darkness. St. Paul, in the second reading, urges us to not be asleep spiritually. We sometimes get distracted. We fall into routine. We forget God's presence in daily life. He calls us to choose light over darkness, love over selfishness, grace over sin.

<u>Here is the Advent invitation:</u> Wake up your soul! Don't live on autopilot. So, what should we do during Advent? It is not merely decorating, shopping, and preparing our homes—but preparing our hearts. Spend one moment of silence daily. Sit with God and listen. Do an act of kindness each day. Make Christ visible. Try to uproot habits of sin. Make room for grace. One step toward reconciliation or forgiveness brings peace to a relationship.



OCIA CORNER FOR ADVENT (Part 1) by Sherry Eastwood Falls

The following is based on an article by Professor Sharon Hickson entitled "What Dickens Teaches Us in A Christmas Carol"

Part 1 - The classic tale: A Christmas Carol, helps us to usher in Advent and await the joy of the Incarnation of Christmas. The novel has five parts. In part one, we learn that "Jacob Marley is dead." But, worse than that, we learn that one who is physically living (SCROOGE), is spiritually dead. So dead in fact that he doesn't even know it.

In contrast to this, we see Scrooge's nephew Fred who declares that "Christmas is a good time, a kind and forgiving, charitable, pleasant time." Scrooge resists Fred's good cheer with his statement "Bah humbug" which he says frequently!

Scrooge gets a warning later that night from "a ghost from Hell" Jacob Marley, his former business partner, who tells Scrooge that he still has a chance to escape his fate.
