
Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope.

Gíving ~ It's that time of year again and our Christmas Giving Trees will be set-up in both parishes from Saturday, November 29th thru Sunday, December 14th. This year we will be supporting the clients at the Alameda County St. Vincent de Paul Community Center along with fellow Alameda families supported by both our parish conference and the conference at St. Barnabas.

This Christmas we will be requesting fewer specific gifts for individuals and asking for more grocery, gift and gas cards. This is because we are serving many more neighbors with various needs or those transitioning into temporary and permanent housing than in the past.
