DECEMBER 14, 2025 THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT ~ GAUDETE SUNDAY

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today is called Gaudete Sunday "Rejoice Sunday" On this Gaudete Sunday the Gospel shows us John the Baptist in prison sending a question to Jesus: "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" A very surprising question because John, who once confidently pointed to Jesus and said, "Behold the Lamb of God," is now struggling in darkness, pain, and uncertainty. We think prison has changed his perspective. He expected the Messiah to come with judgment and power. Instead, Jesus came with mercy and healing. Jesus answered with signs of hope: "The blind see the lame walk the poor hear good news" In other words, the Kingdom of God is not about fear, but restoration.

Here we understand deeply what it means "rejoice" This joy is not cheap happiness. It is joy that exists even in hardship. Like John, many of us sit in our own "prisons" — illness, loneliness, financial stress, broken relationships. We wonder, "Lord, are you really here for me?" Jesus answers us the same way: Look around. See the lives being changed. See forgiveness happening. See the sick comforted. See hearts transformed. That is where Jesus is present. It is okay to ask questions. It is okay to struggle. It is okay to wait. But do not lose hope. True Advent joy is this: God is already at work, even when we do not see it clearly.




