Lindsay's role will be changing from the beginning of February. Her training curacy (paid for by the Diocese) finishes at the end of January. However, we are delighted that she will be continuing to live and work among us. We have a grant from the Growing Faith Foundation to encourage the formation of faith in children and families at the intersection of church, school and family. Combining that with some money the church had in a fund for a Children and Families worker means that we will be able to employ Lindsay as Community Pioneer for 3 days a week for the next 2 years. She will be working to support children and families within and beyond the church.

She will continue to exercise her ministry among us as an ordained Deacon / Associate Minister but this will be in a self-supporting capacity.

Please pray for her as she settles into this new pattern of life and ministry.

Once we receive your completed form, payments will be issued on the second Friday that follows.


