Mary, Martha and Lazarus were siblings and were some of Jesus' closest friends. The home they shared in Bethany, just outside Jerusalem, was a haven for him. It was Mary who anointed his feet with a costly perfume, Lazarus who Jesus raised from the dead while Martha showed her care practically.

We will unpack some of the lessons we can learn from these 3 intriguing characters as they are introduced to us by the Gospels.
