Clergy Team Update



Loving God


You delight in us as your children,

We are inviting teens to come together on their way home from school to pray for an hour from 4.00 - 5.00pm. This will be supervised by recognised youth specialists from our churches.


At other times you can simply book in, or turn up, and make use of the prayer stations which will be in the main room.

This will take place at **7:30pm on Saturday 24 January 2026 at Portishead Youth Centre**, Harbour Road, Portishead BS20 7DD.

The keynote speaker will be Tom Leimdorfer, a childhood Holocaust survivor from Budapest who came to England as a teenage refugee 69 years ago; he will reflect on his family's losses, his journey, and the challenges facing the modern world. The event will also feature music from Bristol-based instrumentalist Knud Stuwe, and refreshments will be served.
