

Greetings from Revd Tonya

Autumn has definitely arrived. The trees are quickly changing colour and there is more than a nip in the air first thing in the morning. Yesterday I went for a walk through some woods and as I looked down I saw that I was walking on a carpet of beautiful golden and red leaves. The wind was gently blowing and the leaves silently fell from the trees. As they fell, they left tiny scars on their branches, which in a few months' time will be the very place where tiny buds will grow. It struck me that though autumn can seem like the end of life, it is, in fact, a sign of a new beginning.

The cycle of nature never ceases to amaze me. It is an image that St. Paul used when writing to the people of Corinth about life and death.

Loss is so hard to weather, and many of us know how it saps our energy and leaves us feeling hopeless and defeated. Yet perhaps the image from the natural world is a good one. For, as Christians we do not believe loss and death is final. We believe that Jesus came to defeat death, enabling each of us to share with him in the place he went to prepare for us. We also believe that through his spirit God can help us work through whatever losses we have experienced, finding new life after what seemed like an end.

It is those facts we remember at the beginning of this month - All Souls Day on Sunday 2nd November at 4.30pm, St. Peters Church. It's a special service for anyone at all, who has known the pain of loss and allows us to remember with thanksgiving to God those whom we have known and loved and who have died. During this service, hymns will be sung, prayers will be said and space for silence given as we remember those who have died. Names of the departed will be read out and a candle lit in their remembrance.

I invite you to pop that date in your diary and come to share with others as we join in remembering the lives of loved ones and give our thanks to God.

Bishop Michael Welcomes the appointment of the Rt Revd and Rt Hon Dame Sarah Mullally DBE as the next Archbishop of Canterbury.

He says, "I am delighted that the Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally, has been appointed as the next Archbishop of Canterbury. This is wonderful news for the Church of England, and the wider Anglican Communion. As our country's former Chief Nurse and as someone who has served as bishop of one of our largest and most complex dioceses, Sarah brings an abundance of leadership skills to the role which will be hugely important as we move forward together as a Church, as a country, and as part of a global society.

Having worked closely with Sarah in her role as lead Bishop for Health I have experienced at first hand Sarah's ability, wisdom and empathy. Sarah's nomination also marks a wonderful milestone for our Church. In England, our journey has taken us from the ordination of women as priests in 1994 to the consecration of our first woman bishop in 2015. Now the first woman will serve as Archbishop of Canterbury and her appointment will change our Church and the whole Anglican Communion forever.

I and all of us in Bath and Wells, will be praying for Sarah, Eamonn and their family as Sarah prepares to take on this role.

News from our Mission Partner

St. Peter's Church and School, Northern Uganda - The Effects of Climate Change

Geoffrey Otto is our man in Uganda. He lives in Oguta Village and is a key member of St Peter's Church and chair of governors at St Peter's Primary. Here, he tells us about climate change in Oguta and the surrounding area.

The implications of climate change here are as follows:- The rising temperatures have resulted in water scarcity and food insecurity among members of the community. Health hazards through air and water pollution are on the increase. Diseases, for instance, nodding syndrome, are rising. Some people are being forced to move to other places looking for better weather, where there is rainfall for cultivation, and better water. Increased hunger and poor nutrition among members of the community are sadly leading to more deaths. There is pressure on mental health as many are being forced or displaced from their homes. A particular issue

for us is that there was a refugee camp near us. Much deforestation happened and that, along with the desire to make charcoal, is now making conditions worse for local people.

Both the church and school have a scheme on environmental protection. In school it is called 'tree talk'. And in our church we call it 'go green'. These deal in environmental protection through tree planting and advocating for conservation measures. There is some crop diversification which helps farmers.

Our Harvest collections are being sent to St. Peter's Church and School. Thank you for your continued generosity.



Will Aid Month


If getting an up-to-date Will is on your to-do list, but have been put off by the cost, now might be the month to make it a priority!

Every November there is a Will Aid campaign in partnership with a number of charities, including Christian Aid. Participating solicitors volunteer their time and waive their fee for writing a basic Will. Instead, they invite clients to make a voluntary donation to Will Aid – suggesting £120 for a single basic Will and £200 for a pair of basic 'mirror' wills. Go to https://www.willaid.org.uk for further information.

Some charities will offer a free will writing service at different times of the year in return for a donation to their charity. Examples, are the Alzheimer's Society Will to Remember Will-writing service for the over 60s and Macmillan Cancer Support who offer the service to anyone over the age of 18.

Another initiative is **Free Wills Month** which brings together a group of well-respected charities to offer members of the public aged 55 and over the opportunity to have their simple Wills written or updated free of charge by using solicitors in selected locations across the UK. The next 'free' month is March. Go to https:freewillsmonth.org.uk to register your interest.

The Church of England has partnered with Farewill to offer a free online will writing service throughout the year. Let's walk into the light

A story that's often told in our churches comes from the fourth chapter of John's Gospel. It tells of Jesus, in the blinding heat of midday meeting a Samaritan woman at the well in a town called Sychar. The woman is hoisting up heavy buckets of water in the hot sun. She's there because she's a woman with 'a reputation' and it's the only time of day she can avoid the muttering of her neighbours who meet at the well at cooler hours.

In an extraordinary encounter, Jesus sees deep into the woman's heart. Through their conversation Jesus brings about her healing and restoration into the community from which she is estranged. It's a story of life, possibility, new beginnings and forgiveness.

The woman at the well is not the only Biblical story set in Sychar. There's another, contained in the 34th chapter of the Book of Genesis. This is a tale of terror that's never heard in our churches; the rape of a girl called Dinah. It's a dark, nasty tale of violence that wrecks the life of individuals, families and the entire community. So we don't speak about it. We keep it hidden.

Sometimes people say to me of safeguarding 'It's just a tick box exercise', an onerous compliance requirement. Rather I would say that our work in safeguarding asks

fundamental questions about the kind of places we want our churches to be. Just like the Bible passages I've mentioned, we can be places of hiddenness, silence, and hurt. Or places of life, new beginnings and restoration.

Accounts like the Makin review have shone light on our story. We've also been working hard to bring about change. While we cannot be complacent, I am intensely proud of all that was revealed about safeguarding in Bath and Wells by our independent audit that happened earlier this year. This told us that we are moving towards a much better story. So let's build on the momentum we have created. Let's walk into the light.


