

Here I am, Lord. Use me

There's a phrase that's echoed through the centuries in monastic communities around the world: "Ora et labora" — pray and work. It's the heartbeat of the monastic life, where no job is too small, no task too humble, and everything — from singing psalms, making jam or tending the garden- is done as an offering to God.

Life in Portishead can sometimes seem far removed from monastic life; we don't live behind monastery walls or wear habits. But around 1883, Portishead was home to a Franciscan friary mission, the Conventual Franciscans (also known as the Greyfriars due to the grey colour of their habits) were invited from France to establish a friary and mission in Portishead, based at Claremont and Belle Vue on West Hill

While Franciscans, including the Greyfriars, do value prayer and work, their core motto emphasises poverty, service to the poor, "Pax et Bonum" (Peace and Good). This motto reflects their Franciscan values of peace, simplicity, and service to others, stemming from the teachings of St. Francis of Assisi.

We might be unaccustomed to the monastic way of life, but to live a prayerful life, of peace, work and service to others, is something we can all learn from. Our church communities don't need more volunteers or more rotas, we simply need to learn from those who have been before us, those disciples who understand that being part of the Body of Christ means doing as well as believing.

It means spending time in prayer, rolling up our sleeves, offering our time, and seeing every task — even the unglamorous ones — as part of our shared calling.

When you visit a monastery, you will notice that all the work is shared. The monks can't choose their duties; getting out of the washing up isn't an option! Each person serves the community as needed, serving not as a volunteer, but as someone who has said "yes" to a life following Christ.

In our own church life, it's tempting to see requests for help — with cleaning, tidying the churchyard, taking down old notices, removing wilted flowers — as optional extras, things we might consider if we have time.

But that's the language of volunteering. Discipleship speaks differently. It says: Here I am, Lord. Use me.

Of course, there are tasks that we can't physically do, tasks that make us feel uncomfortable and would cause us anxiety. As we need to learn to say yes, we also need to

know our limitations and not forget that the monastic way of life has a discipline of Sabbath and rest. Some people can do more; some only a little. But if everyone does something, the whole community thrives. And that's the point. Church is not run by "them" — it is us. All of us.

So next time you hear a quiet plea for help — whether it's cleaning and tidying the churches, helping on a rota, or simply praying regularly for the parish — don't hear it as a burden. Hear it as an invitation. A way to join in the life of the church, not as a helper-on-the-side, but

as someone deeply rooted in the mission and ministry of Jesus.

And if you are one of those faithful people who already give your time and energy, thank you. Truly. You are a blessing. As it says in Matthew 25:23, "Well done, good and faithful servant... come and share your master's happiness."

Let's all commit to the work and prayer of the church — not as volunteers who come and go, but as disciples, who belong.



Leaving a Legacy

Have you ever considered leaving money to the church after your death?

As I write, last Sunday's (3/8/25) Gospel reading was Luke 12 v 13-21. A man in the crowd asks Jesus to intervene in a dispute with his brother over their inheritance. Jesus declines to act as a judge and cautions against all kinds of greed, as life does not consist in the abundance of possessions. Jesus tells the parable of the Rich Fool. He uses a story about a man who amasses wealth but neglects his relationship with God, to illustrate the dangers of greed and the importance of spiritual wealth. In the parable, a rich man's land produces a large harvest, and instead of sharing his abundance, he decides to build bigger barns to store his surplus. He plans to live a life of ease and comfort, but God tells him he will die that night, and his accumulated wealth will be of no use.

The Bible also tells us that it is hard for a rich man to enter the Kingdom of Heaven (Matthew 19:24)

And yet we find it so hard to put God first and instead make excuses for a bit of 'retail therapy', a bigger house or car! Or perhaps we find it hard to make ends meet with the cost of living crisis, pressures to 'keep up with the Joneses' (no offence to any Mr. & Mrs. Jones out there!) or the perceived pressures of presenting a certain lifestyle on social media. There are many and varied reasons why we place a higher value on personal possessions than on our relationship to God and the stewarding and sharing of his resources. If we cannot manage it while on earth, perhaps we can through our death?

For many people, leaving a gift in their will is the final opportunity to make a last gift to God, in thanks for the gifts of our lifetime. It is also a way to make a lasting difference to the future of our church and community.

To ensure that our wishes are carried out, we need to take will writing and reviews seriously-setting our affairs in order, and stewarding them wisely to the end of our time on earth and beyond.

No matter how large or small, every gift in every will makes a difference.

After all, 'All things come from God, and of your own do we give you.' (1 Chronicles 29:14)

Generosity begets Generosity

In August I was privileged to dedicate the restored clock in the tower of Montacute church. It's not just any old clock. In fact, Montacute's is amongst the oldest in the country. Built in the village in around 1400, the clock is so old that it is held in place by iron wedges. At the time of its construction, the nut and the bolt wouldn't be invented for another hundred years!

The Montacute clock is an artefact that seems to generate generosity. In the 1980s the clock was restored by Humphrey Hamlin, for whom it is now named. Humphrey poured time and energy into its mechanism, preventing it from being scrapped. During the last two years, heroic efforts by the people of Montacute have led to its further restoration. All this was marked last month by a whole village gathering. The community choir sang, morris men danced, the local pub provided a hog roast, cake was dispended in huge quantities.

Montacute is a beautiful example of how generosity begets generosity. Like a chain reaction, one act of generosity, the restoration of the clock, led to another, another and another. As a result, a whole community was brought together in celebration and joy.

In his second letter to the Church in Corinth, Paul writes of the church in Macedonia that 'their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity' (2 Cor 8:2). Having nothing, the Macedonians discovered that they could still give. In turn, their generosity enabled Paul to challenge and encourage the church in Corinth to do the same. All to help the struggling Church in Jerusalem.

As I travel around our diocese, I see this pattern of generosity begetting generosity happening in so many places. One person starts, another adds their contribution, more join in and soon we learn that together we are so much more than the sum of our parts. This is the economy of God. It's an economy that all of us are invited to join.


