Reflections in Mary Anne's own words....

Working as Nancy Reagan's photographer was a great honor. I was able to travel the world with her. I recorded her visit with the emperor of Japan; the wedding of Charles and Diana; the wedding of Andrew and Sarah; the king of Thailand, the Pope, the funeral of Princess Grace; trips to Singapore, Stockholm, Bali.

And on and on. Nancy Reagan represented our country beautifully.

I was in the midst of planning my wedding and was under the gun to get to Toledo in time to meet the Ohio obligation to spend three days in residence before obtaining a marriage license. Mrs. Reagan knew it and came to my rescue. She took my arm and announced, "This girl is getting married and must leave now," where upon all conversation and photo requests stopped and I was sent on my way in a New York City police car with a local Secret Service agent accompanying me to get me through the lines and onto my plane.

How could you not love a woman who would do that for you?

Thanks to Nancy, Mary Anne became Mary Anne Fackelman-Miner and lives happily in Hawaii.
