THE RETURN OF THE MAN IN THE YELLOW SLICKER

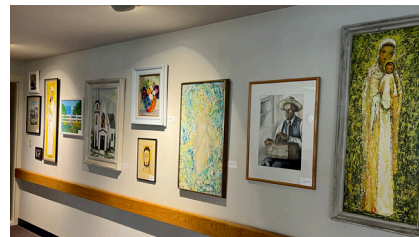
