Listen with Eyes and Heart

tuck in the clogged aisle of an airplane, I felt anxious about whether I could catch my next flight. In the crowded backlog of bodies and baggage, a 4-month-old baby caught my eye. The baby stared intently at my face in a way that snapped me out of my frustration. I said a friendly "Hello!" The baby seemed curious about me. I realized that my mask covered my mouth, and perhaps the baby wondered how I could talk without a visible mouth. I lowered my mask to smile at the baby as I repeated my greeting, "Hello there! You are so cute!" My heart melted as the baby smiled back with an all-encompassing joyful grin and wiggled with glee. The baby's mother chuckled. It delighted me to observe the way the baby made a joyful connection with me without words. As I reflected on the situation, I realized that I had to pause and pay attention with more than just my ears to understand the baby's message.

Sia Nyasari Temu, MM writes about the importance of communication as a methodology for interculturality, conflict transformation, and reconciliation in a chapter of the book *Engaging Our Diversity: Interculturality and Consecrated Life Today* (edited by Maria Cimperman, RSCJ and Roger Schroeder, SVD, 2020). Temu asserts that "each of us...needs to be open to other people's stories and to create a space to learn, listen, and be

prepared to be surprised by others..." She further explains that nonviolent communication "...involves active listening with the ears, the eyes, and the heart, as well as being able to hear what the other person really means."

In community life, I sometimes misunderstand sisters if I am not open to hearing their stories. I think my daily contemplative prayer helps me to create inner spaciousness to listen before I leap into judgments, but I still have room for improvement.

Sometimes I hear a sister's words but miss the true meaning if I am not listening with my eyes and my heart along with my ears.

"Listening is such a simple act...We just have to be willing to sit there and listen. If we can do that as Margaret Wheatley suggests in *Finding Our Way:* Leadership for Uncertain Times, "we create moments in which real healing is available."

Considering the recent school shootings and political violence in our nation, I am aware of the need to work for nonviolence to become a societal norm. What if we each work in our own congregations and civic communities to create a culture of listening with our ears, eyes, and hearts? What if we engage in daily quiet prayer to ask God for the gift of openness to listen to others? What if we do simple things, like the baby looking at me on the airplane, to make peaceful connections with others?

Sister Mary Gretchen Puffenberger

Sister Mary Gretchen Puffenberger was born Mary Catherine Puffenberger in Tiffin, Ohio. She attended Calvert High School and entered the Ursuline Convent in 1931 from St. Joseph Parish. Sister M. Gretchen attended Mary Manse and Desales Colleges but received both her Bachelor's and Master's degrees from the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago, Illinois. Sister M. Gretchen spent her life teaching music, primarily piano lessons. She went out to various schools for this purpose. She became the head of the Music Department at Mary Manse and taught classes in Harmony, Survey of Music Literature, Strict and Free Counterpoint. After Mary Manse closed, Sister M. Gretchen taught private music lessons until her untimely death after falling down the outside stairs at Jacob House. She died at St. Vincent's Hospital on October 14, 1989 at the age of 76. She is buried in St. Joseph Cemetery in Tiffin.
