Ursuline Sisters Elect New Leadership Team for 2022 - 2026 Term

The new Ursuline Convent Leadership Team was officially elected on April 13, 2022 and took office on June 14, 2022, serving until 2026. Sister Sandra Sherman is General Superior/President. Assisting on the General Council is Sister Donna Frey, Sister Bernarda Breidenbach and Sister Joy Gray.

Sister Sandy served as President of the Toledo Ursulines for the 2018 - 2022 term and was re-elected to this position. In addition to the responsibilities of leadership, she continues to be involved in Rahab's Heart, a ministry she co-founded which is a Christian non-profit organization whose volunteers walk with women who have been broken due to the trauma of trafficking, exploitation, abuse, addiction, and/or poverty. Her relationship with the women keeps her grounded in the call of Pope Francis to befriend those on the margins in a culture of encounter.

For the past 12 years, Sister Donna has been serving at St. Ursula Academy part-time in the area of Ursuline and Catholic Identity. In this re-elected term of leadership, her ministry around the spirit of St. Angela Merci and Ursuline connections will continue at St. Ursula in different and varying ways. As a member of the Leadership Team she will be focusing on responsibilities related to carrying out the priorities set by the Community.

Sister Bernarda also served on the Leadership Team during the 2018-2022 term and has been re-elected. She continues to be involved in meeting individual and communal needs of the Sisters. Sister Bernarda serves on the St. Ursula Academy and Ursuline Convent Boards. She also volunteers each week at Sunshine Communities here in Toledo.



Sister Joy Gray served in the past on Community Leadership and currently volunteers at St. Luke's Hospital. She has served on the St. Ursula Academy Board of Trustees and Ursuline Center Board before the closing of Ursuline Center. Past ministries include teaching and administration in Toledo Diocesan schools and service at the Ursuline Center in Human Resources.

The Chapter of Affairs in 2022 set five priorities for the leadership and community: Ministry of Prayer and Presence, Relationship with St. Ursula Academy,

Women Religious Archives Collaborative

Here in Ohio, the Ursulines of Toledo, Cleveland and Cincinnati and the Ursulines of Louisville, Kentucky, have committed to be participants in the Women Religious Archives Collaborative. The Toledo Ursulines are excited to be one of the founding communities of this project.

The following are excerpts from the Case For Support, June 2022 that give a further understanding of the project.

"The impact of vowed women religious across the United States is immeasurable. That women religious have significantly impacted this country since their arrival in 1727 is indisputable -- through their tireless efforts in spiritual formation, education, health care, and social service, and in their commitment to contemplation and action. Women religious have forged a rich history... captured in the annals of individual communities, each with its own distinctive character and contribution.

Imagine this unique historical data suddenly rendered inaccessible or, worse, gone forever...!

"... The decreasing number of sisters in the United States highlights the urgency in developing a plan for keeping the mission, charism, and history of sisters alive. Based on 2020 statistics from the National Religious Retirement Office (NRRO), of 404 congregations surveyed nationwide, 15% have fewer than 10 members and 40% fewer than 25. Perhaps most telling of all, half of all women religious are beyond 80 years of age.

"Women religious across the United States are engaged in strategic legacy planning that is multifaceted in scope and yet specific to the varying needs of each congregation. One such issue is the management and planning for the preservation of congregational archives.

"In an effort to address this issue, 12 congregations in Ohio, Pennsylvania and Kentucky have committed to an initiative to establish a collaborative archives center in Northeast Ohio... Congregations need collaborative solutions to safeguard their histories and promote their stories of mission and charism to future generations...

"To provide a formal structure to these efforts, the Women Religious Archives Collaborative was officially established as a 501(c)3 corporation registered in the State of Ohio. The Women Religious Archives Collaborative Center will serve as a permanent repository for the archives of Women Religious in Ohio and surrounding regions, as well as a dynamic space open to the public for research and programming...

"The center will be one of many linked together under a 'virtual roof' as part of a network across the United States with links to colleges, universities, libraries, and museums. To accomplish this important initiative, we are considering a Capital Campaign to fund the creation of the proposed Heritage Center. We are excited about this project and believe

the community will respond generously to the call to assist both the participating congregations and future generations who will come to know these rich legacies, protected in perpetuity and appropriately available to others in a scholarly atmosphere."

I then retired to join a group of volunteers as a spiritual visitor to residents at the Ursuline Center. In 2012 I became a resident myself at the Center until its closing in 2021. A Journey of a Lifetime...



Ursuline Associate Kitty Meyers Gains Hungarian Citizenship

Since my grandparents were both born in Hungary, I was told I could become a Hungarian citizen via Simplified Naturalization. As it turns out this hasn't been simple at all. I had to learn the Hungarian language, fill out 30 pages of Hungarian citizenship application forms, and travel to Chicago to the Hungarian Consulate for a Citizenship interview and verbal Hungarian language exam.

In May 2020 I began taking Hungarian lessons via Zoom from Hungary every Sunday morning. The lessons include learning the language, studying the history of Hungary, and learning about Hungarian customs and cuisine. I can honestly say that this has been the most challenging undertaking of my life thus far. The Hungarian alphabet has 44 letters with 14 vowels, there is no set word order, and punctuation and pronunciation are so very different from English. I found that if I was going to succeed in learning Hungarian that I needed to forget many of the rules of the English language that I learned from 12 years of Ursuline education at St. Agnes and St. Ursula. Learning Hungarian has brought my Father's voice back to me in a way that I haven't heard since his death in 2005 and it wraps me in a big hug. Though very difficult to learn, the Hungarian language is also very beautiful and lyrical.

After satisfying the requirements of the Hungarian government to obtain citizenship I received email notification in April 2022 informing me that at the request of the President of the Republic of Hungary I became a naturalized citizen! I learned in a follow-up email that I'd be taking the Hungarian citizenship oath on June 22, 2022 at the Hungarian Consulate in Chicago. I then began memorizing the citizenship oath and found that it ends with the words "So help me God" just as the American citizenship oath ends. I also learned the Hungarian Himnusz/Anthem so I could sing it proudly at the oath ceremony.

My sister, Debbie, suggested that I wear a dress with

pockets on the day of my





oath so I could tuck a tissue into one of them because I would surely cry. I put a tissue in one pocket. In the other pocket I put a photo of my Hungarian grandfather and my Father as they have been my inspiration on this journey. One of my teachers



When my husband, Larry, and I arrived at the Consulate we joined 10 others who were taking their citizenship oaths. Family members were seated behind those taking the oath. The Consul General, Támas Kovács, arrived and we stood to sing Himnusz. He gave a brief talk about Hungary before asking us to stand for the oath. I began to cry tears of pride and utter happiness as I tried to say 'Isten engem úgy segéljen' (So help me God) and had to say those words to myself. I then signed my naturalization document and the Consul General shook my hand and a group photo was taken. My husband pinned a USA/Hungarian pin to my dress and took a photo of me holding my small Hungarian flag. What a day to celebrate as my ancestors looked down from above with pride!

Throughout my journey to Hungarian citizenship I

was supported by my husband, my friends, and the Ursuline Sisters and Associates who kept me in prayer every step of the way. I am grateful to them all.

Sister Mary Jo Koudelka

Sister Mary Jo Koudelka, OSU, formerly Sister Joseph Anne, died Monday, May 23, 2022 at The Grove at Oakleaf Village, Toledo, Ohio.

Sister Mary Jo entered the Ursuline Convent in 1952 from St. Joseph Parish, Tiffin, Ohio. Sister Mary Jo attended St. Joseph School in Tiffin, St. Ursula Academy,

and earned a Bachelor's degree from Mary Manse College and Master's degree from the University of Toledo. She also took advanced study courses at Xavier University.

Sister Mary Jo's teaching career was spent at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Teresa, Nazareth Hall, and St. Angela Hall, where she also served as principal. She taught at St. Anthony Villa and was a coordinator at Cardinal Stritch High School while working part-time in fund raising. Sister Mary Jo was part of the pastoral team at Ursuline Center for 15 years. In 2000, Sister Mary Jo was the Caretaker at Oblate Residences Senior Housing and worked part-time at Swan Creek Retirement Village and at Hafner's Florist. Following the Toledo Ursuline mission to be available for any work of charity, Sister Mary Jo tutored at Women Blessing Women and was a Reader/Recorder of the Catholic Chronicle for Equal Access Ministry (for the visually impaired). She also volunteered at Mercy Health St. Anne's Hospital and Ursuline Center.

Perhaps most fulfilling to Sister Mary Jo was her volunteer work at Hospice of Northwest Ohio. Several years ago, Sister Mary Jo wrote, "For many years I had hoped that someday I would be able to give service to Hospice of Northwest Ohio. From the beginning I knew

I could not do this work on my own, so I asked the Lord to enter each situation through me and direct me in the best way possible. Each week I experience what I call "Little Miracles" and when I go home, I know I have received much more than I have given that day."

As a final act of service, Sister Mary Jo donated her body to The University of Toledo, College of Medicine.

Sister Margaret Ann Babione

Sister Margaret Ann Babione, OSU, formerly Sister Mary Roberta, died at Otterbein Sunset House on May 31, 2022.

Sister Margaret Ann
entered the Ursuline Convent in
September of 1943 from
St. Thomas Aquinas Parish, Toledo,
Ohio. She graduated from Central
Catholic High School and attended Mary
Manse College where she earned a Bachelor's degree.
Sister Margaret Ann achieved her Master's degree from
Catholic University of America (Toledo Branch) and
Certificate of Pastoral Ministry from St. Louis University,
St. Louis, Missouri.

Sister Margaret Ann taught at Rosary Cathedral, St. Charles and St. Agnes schools in Toledo; St. Joseph, Tiffin; St. Gerard, Lima; and St. Rose, Perrysburg, where she served as principal for five years.

Sister Margaret Ann helped with records when Mary Manse College closed in 1975-76. She then went on to hold Pastoral Ministry positions at St. Francis Xavier, Stillwater, Oklahoma, and at the University of Tennessee, Morton, Tennessee for five years, then came to help in the Diocese of Toledo for three years followed by 10 years working in outreach programs in Monroe and Frenchtown, Michigan Senior Centers.



How It All Began...

Samuel Cardinal Stritch, Second Bishop of Toledo, Asks Ursulines to Open a College for Women in the Diocese of Toledo

Two months after his installation, November 1922, Bishop Stritch called at the Convent and proposed to Mother Scholastica, as superior, that the Ursulines, as the oldest teaching order in the diocese, undertake a work dear to his heart, the founding of a Catholic liberal arts college for women. He said he believed that women had the same right as men to the benefit of higher education. The Bishop's philosophy of education can be summed up in his own words spoken at the opening Mass of Mary Manse College, September 15, 1922: "Enlightened young womanhood, cultured after the teaching of the Church, shall become a benediction to mankind."

At first the nuns were hesitant about assuming such a burden. They were not prepared academically or financially. Buildings would be needed, a faculty provided. They wished, however, to do what the Bishop asked, and after praying and consulting the Community, the Chapter at length decided to undertake the first step in higher education for women in the Diocese of Toledo.

The title agreed upon was Mary Manse, meaning house of Mary, suggested by Bishop Stritch.
