

For many of us who mourn the recent passing of Fr. Bob on March 11, 2021, he made a great impact on our lives as a teacher, counselor and friend. Father was known for his

courses on theology and his ability to make the words of scripture come alive while at Mary Manse. In his early years of seminary life and priesthood, he was influenced by the Jesuit theologian, scientist, philosopher and paleontologist Pierre Teihard deChardin who developed the theory that man is evolving mentally and socially toward a final spiritual unity with God. He shared his thoughts to his students in teaching theology. Though sometimes difficult to understand, he was always approachable and no question was not worthy of his time. Many of his students and parishioners have often said Fr. Bob opened the words of the gospel to them so they were able to grasp the meaning of the words.

After his days at Mary Manse, he continued to meet with 5 bible study groups - young and old for many years on a monthly basis while shepherding parishes as their pastor. He also made time for anyone who wanted to talk among them, priest, parishioners, friend and stranger. He often said he learned from them as well and it helped him to gain further insights into the study of the relationship of the earthly to the super earthly and the Cosmic Christ, again all things evolving into a perfect union with Jesus Christ, the son of the living God.Desespite Fr. Bob's failing health, he continued to see those who sought his counsel and conversation right up to the last days of his life. May the Lord welcome him into his heavenly kingdom for his faithfulness to his word throughout his lifetime and his willingness to share it with us.

### This Group of Women Shared a Common Commitment

After 28 years as an Ursuline, I left the convent in 1988 and taught in Toledo Public Schools for 15 years. During that time I took care of my mother until she died in 1995. I retired in 2003.

Travel began with family camping trips in the U.S. and then expanded to foreign adventures after my mother died. Travel was always a pleasure because of people I met, different cultures, and my life-long love of nature.

Trips include locations around the world (64 countries) including a safari in Krueger National Park in Africa, four trips to Rome, 25 cruises on different size ships to places such as Argentina, the Falklands, Denmark, Sweden, Finland, Russia, Germany, Norway, the Baltic Sea, Turkey (Istanbul, Ephesus), Greece (Athens), Egypt (Cairo, Alexandria), Cuba, the Caribbean Islands, Japan (Tokyo), Canada (Vancouver, Toronto, Montreal, Quebec City), Costa Rica, Asia (Dubai, Singapore, Doha, Qatar, India), the South Pacific, and Iceland.

Covid has cancelled five planned cruises; hope remains for an October 27-day cruise from South Hampton to NYC.

After graduating from Mary Manse College in 1960, I entered the Toledo Ursuline Community. During my 22 years as Sister Frances Cabrini, I taught elementary, secondary and college classes. I also worked for the Toledo Diocese as Coordinator of Liturgy Education, visiting parishes around the diocese helping implement the liturgical renewal mandated by Vatican II. Upon departing religious life in 1982, I moved to the Twin Cities area of Minnesota and worked as a Director of Liturgy and Music at St. Rita's Catholic Church in Cottage Grove. During this time I was also a Liturgy/theology instructor at St. Paul's Seminary in St. Paul as well as a member of the Archdiocesan Worship Comission.

In 1982 I returned to Toledo, Ohio where I became the liturgy/music director at St. Patrick of Heatherdowns Church. I remained in the position until 19 years later. During those 19 years, I also was liturgy instructor at St. Meinrad Seminary for three summers. After returning from a full-time position, the next several years I subbed at various

parish schools in the area, including Little Flower and St. John XXIII.

In 2009, I moved back to my home town of Fremont, Ohio. I began playing the organ for Zion Lutheran Church in Gibsonburg, Ohio. In 2013, I became choir director at St. Ann's Catholic Church in Fremont, the parish of my birth and childhood. Most recently I have returned to Zion Lutheran Church in Gibsonburg.

In my so-called retirement, I also work at an exercise place, three half-days a week. It has benefitted my own will to exercise. I play bridge, bingo, go to the casino occasionally and spend important time with family and friends. I have been blessed with good health, so life is very rewarding.

I remember my Mary Manse days with fondness and attribute those four wonderful years of laying the foundation for the years that would follow.

After nine years in the Ursuline Convent, I left the order in 1969 and continued to teach in Toledo at St. Catherine's School. Soon after, I married and we moved to Findlay, OH where I volunteered for handicapped children. I also substituted in the Catholic grade school.

After two years, we moved to Columbus, OH where I taught in a preschool for four years. My husband at the time worked for Ohio Bell. AT & T had formed a subsidiary with the government of Iran to update their communications. My husband applied. We lived there for 14 months until the Shah was deposed. Before that we were fortunate to travel to Russia, Egypt, and Thailand, as well as Singapore.

Living in Tehran was unforgettable. We traveled within the country too. We were sorry to leave under such unfortunate circumstances..

My husband's next employment took us to Atlanta, GA. We lived over in Marietta, GA for 23 years. I taught at a private school for most of that time, mainly middle school..

We loved camping! We graduated from tents to trailers with slide-outs. We were able to visit every state. (continued on page 5)

At the time of leaving the Ursulines, I was principal of St. Agnes Elementary School in West Toledo. The parish has since closed. Thanks to the grace of God and an open-minded pastor and school council, I continued on as principal. There was simply a name change: Sister Barbara to Miss Barbara.

In 1979 I became employed by Toledo Public Schools (TPS). By this time, I had an MA in Educational Administration and 17 years experience in Toledo Catholic Schools. TPS had received a grant to open junior high math labs to support the 7th and 8th graders. Since this was a new venture, TPS was looking for someone with teaching and administrative experience. I had both and was hired. I spent 17 years at the Old West End Junior High School. Teaching remedial math and regular 7th grade math. Yes, this was a challenge for many reasons. My partner and I did see and experience success, though. We really worked with those young people.

In 1996 I transferred to Byrnedale Junior High. My college BA minor in Social Studies and I have always loved these studies. I taught 7th grade Social Studies for 8 years. My students would say, "You really like this stuff, don't you?"

I retired from TPS in 2004. After 42 years in education, I am enjoying the slower life. It is wonderful to sleep later; as an educator I got up at 5:30 a.m. I am joyful that that is in the past. I read a lot and am

very interested in politics and my country. It is a shame our leaders do not seek me out once in a while. I believe I could give them some good advice. I live with my 7 year old Shih Tzu named Koko.

I have never regretted my 10 years as an Ursuline and I have never regretted my return to lay life.


