"Leading When You're Not In Charge" By Trustee Washington

As Trustee, I launched a monthly staff reading initiative to help us grow both personally and professionally, and to ensure we continue serving the people of Adams Township with excellence. This month, we finished the book "How to Lead When You're Not in Charge" by Clay Scroggins.

In his book, he reminds us that we are all leaders. Leadership is not just about the title; it is about using your influence, even when you do not have formal authority. It means leading for the greater good, both for the people you serve and the people you serve alongside.

Scroggins also tells us that to become a better leader, the best thing you can do is "watch and learn from the people who are in charge." He goes on to say, "Look at the leaders you admire (and the leaders you don't admire) and start paying attention to how they lead. The best leaders are learners." By watching the people around you who are in positions of power, you can learn what kind of traits you want to emulate and which ones you want to avoid.


For me, this book helped me reflect deeply on the kind of leader I am and the kind I want to become. "Leadership is not about being authoritative; it is about being collaborative."

- Citilink, any bus, Monday-Friday 5:45 AM-9:45 PM, Saturday 7:30 AM-6:30 PM, Closed July 4.
- Inasmuch Ministry, 930 Broadway, Monday, Wednesday, Friday 7:30 AM- 11 AM, Tuesday, Thursday 8 AM-11 AM, open regardless of temperature. Monday-Friday, 5 PM-7 PM only open when the temperature is 90 degrees or more.
- Project.ME, 2305 Broadway, Monday-Friday, 9 AM-5 PM. Beginning July 1, hours will be expanded to Monday-Friday, 8 AM-8 PM, Saturday, Sunday 12 PM-4 PM. Due to the nature of the services, the center is for adults only.
