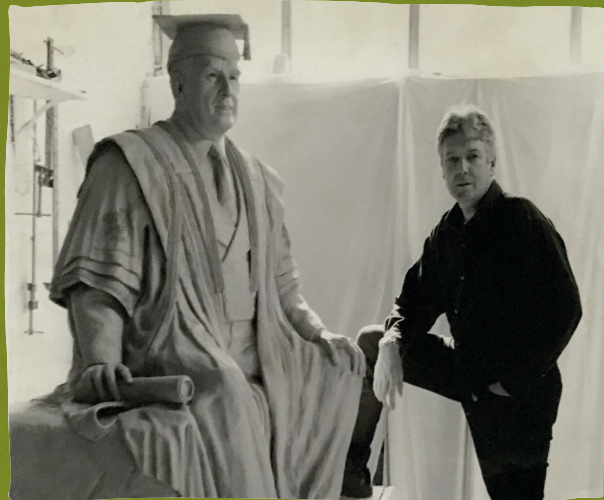


WALK THE TRAIL OF LIVERPOOL'S WORLD FAMOUS SCULPTOR, TOM MURPHY.

№7 BLITZ MEMORIAL 1999

Blitz Memorial commemorates the many thousands of civilian casualties in Liverpool and Bootle during the sustained bombing 1940 – 1941.

The staircase also indicates the way the bombs spiral as they fall.

№4 CAPTAIN JOHNNY WALKER 1998

Memorial to the legendary WW2 Hero, the most successful commander of the Second World War sinking U Boats

№12 BILLY FURY 2003

Commissioned by Sound of Fury fans which took six years of fundraising Billy Fury worked ontug boats on the River Mersey before becoming famous as a singer and was often compared to Elvis Presley

№21 JOHN HULLEY 2019

John Hulley founder of the Liverpool Olympics 1862–1863–1864–1867.

Chaired the first meeting of the National Olympic Association in 1865.

Formed the Liverpool Athletic Club with Charles Melly 1861

Registered the first Across Mersey Swim in the 1863 Grand Liverpool Olympic Festival.

№14 CHANCE MEETING 2009
SIR KEN DODD AND BESSIE BRADDOCK MP

Ken and Bessie travel to London together many times in the 50s and 60s and became best of friends and respected each other views.

№19 LIVERPOOL PALS MEMORIAL 2014
RECRUITMENT AND FAREWELL. TIME TO COME HOME.

Liverpool Lime Street Station was where men and boys queued up to volunteer to fight for their country 100 years ago.

Lord Derby conceived idea of the Pals Regiment. Memorial unveiled by HRH Earl of Wessex.

№13 ROAD PEACE 2005

A Liverpool portrayal of the Human cost of our roads.

Found in St John's Garden at the back of St George's Hall opposite Walker Art Gallery In the shape of a road bollard surrounded by items found at a crash scenes

The inscription says "Injured or Killed, Lives Unfulfilled. The Reality of Road Deaths"

THE STATUES OF LIVERPOOL COMIC



The STATUES OF LIVERPOOL comic imparts true and imaginary tales about the statues and sculptures created by Liverpool's own, world famous artist, Tom Murphy.

It is written by another famous Liverpudlian, Crosby born Tim Quinn in collaboration with several celebrated illustrators from Marvel Comics. Tim, a former writer, and editor for Marvel Comics created adventures for various characters, including X-Men, Spiderman, and Thor, and was friends with the great Stan Lee until Stan passed away in 2018.

Before passing, Stan wrote a poem specifically for Liverpool Heartbeat which can be found in The John Hulley Comic.

№18 HILLSBOROUGH MEMORIAL 2013

Hillsborough Monument to remember those killed in the Hillsborough disaster.

Sited on the corner of William Brown Street and the Old Haymarket in front of St John's Gardens close to Liverpool's World Museum

№5 HENRY COTTON 1998

First Chancellor of Liverpool John Moores University and served as the Lord Lieutenant of Merseyside 1989–1993. The Statue is sited outside the Trueman building which is part of Liverpool John Moores University and was renamed Henry Cotton Building after Princess Anne unveiled a Plaque before touring the building in 1998.

№6 JOHN MOORES 1998

John Moores Statue Commissioned by John Moores University and was unveiled to celebrate the University's 175th anniversary Sir John Moores CBE founded the Littlewoods retail and Football Pools Company. Liverpool John Moores University is named in his honour.

№1 CECIL AND JOHN MOORES 1996

The Statue was commissioned to mark the centenary of Sir John birth.

John's brother Cecil took over the Pools operation in 1932 and ran it as Chairman until 1979.

№15 NOEL CHAVASSE 2011

Noel Chavasse was awarded two Victoria Cross Medals in WW1, one posthumously both for going out on the battlefield at night and carrying wounded soldiers back. Chevasse, a qualified surgeon operated on them, saving many lives.

Other Statues not on any of the two walks.

№20 JOHNNY KING 2014 CH42 9PY

Johnny King most successful Tranmere Football Manager, taking Tranmere FC to Wembley five times.

№22 HOLY TRINITY 2019 L4 4EL

Everton players Kendall Harvey & Ball, known as the "Holy Trinity", were regarded as the best midfield trio in England in the 60s.

№9 COURAGE WITHIN 2001 L17 7BQ

Everyone hits a bad patch sometimes and this statue is about hope for the future. Courage comes from within.

№11 JOHN LENNON 2002 L24 1YD

Liverpool's favourite son.

№3 BILL SHANKLY 1997 L4 0RQ

Turned LFC into one of the finest and most successful footballing sides in Britain.

Also have a look at the Bob Paisley Gates and John Houlding Founder of Liverpool Football Club Bust

№8 DIXIE DEAN 2001 L4 4EL

Born on Merseyside, became the greatest goal machine in the history of world football.

№10 REACH 2002 L33 7ED

Three Anonymous Footballers outside Liverpool FC Academy, Kirkby Merseyside.

№2 PRINCESS DIANA 1997 L8 7SS

Tom Murphy donated the bust of Princess Diana to the Women's Hospital. Princess Diana's last official engagement as H R H Princess of Wales was to open the Liverpool Women's Hospital.

№16 HAROLD WILSON 2011 L36 9UL

Prime Minister 1964–1970 and again 1974–1976. Statue is situated in Huyton Town Centre

LIVERPOOL TOWN HALL

The first recorded Town Hall in Liverpool was 1515, built slightly south of the present Town Hall and was replaced in 1673. A new Town Hall was Built on the present site in 1754 and rebuilt again in 1802. The Building was damages in the Liverpool Blitz in 1941, the damage being restored after the Second World War, with further restoration carried out between 1993–1995.

TOP 10 LIVERPOOL FIRSTS

Liverpool has had many firsts in its long history, here are ten of our favourites:

1715 Worlds First Wet Dock controlled by floodgates (Steers Old Dock) remains can still be seen today through a shaft outside Lewis Store L1.

1776 Worlds First Lifeboat Station at Formby

1790 Liverpool became home to the worlds first overseas American Consulate

1830 The Worlds first Inter–City passenger railway opened between Liverpool & Manchester

1862 John Hulley (1832–1875) became Worlds First Modern Day Olympian

1877 The Walker Art Gallery became the first British public art gallery

1890 Football nets were used for the first time being invented in Liverpool

1909 First Woolworths store opened on Church Street

1913 Liverpool Arthur Wynne produced the Worlds First Crossword puzzle

1953 Liverpool's Lita Roza was the first woman to top the UK singles with *How Much is that Doggy in the Window*

JOHN HULLEY LIVERPOOL'S FIRST SUPERHERO



Born in Kensington, Liverpool 1832 -1875.
Organised Six Olympic Festivals four in Liverpool two in North Wales.
In 1861, along with Charles Melly, founded the Liverpool Athletic Club.
In 1865, Built a Gymnasium in Myrtle Street Liverpool. On the opening day 6th November 1865, John Hulley chaired the first meeting of The National Olympic Association. Present at that meeting were Dr William Penny Brooks, from Much Wenlock and Ernst George Ravenstine, from London.
These three men are known as the Three Founding Fathers of the Modern Day Olympics .

JOHN HULLEYS SPORTING LEGACY

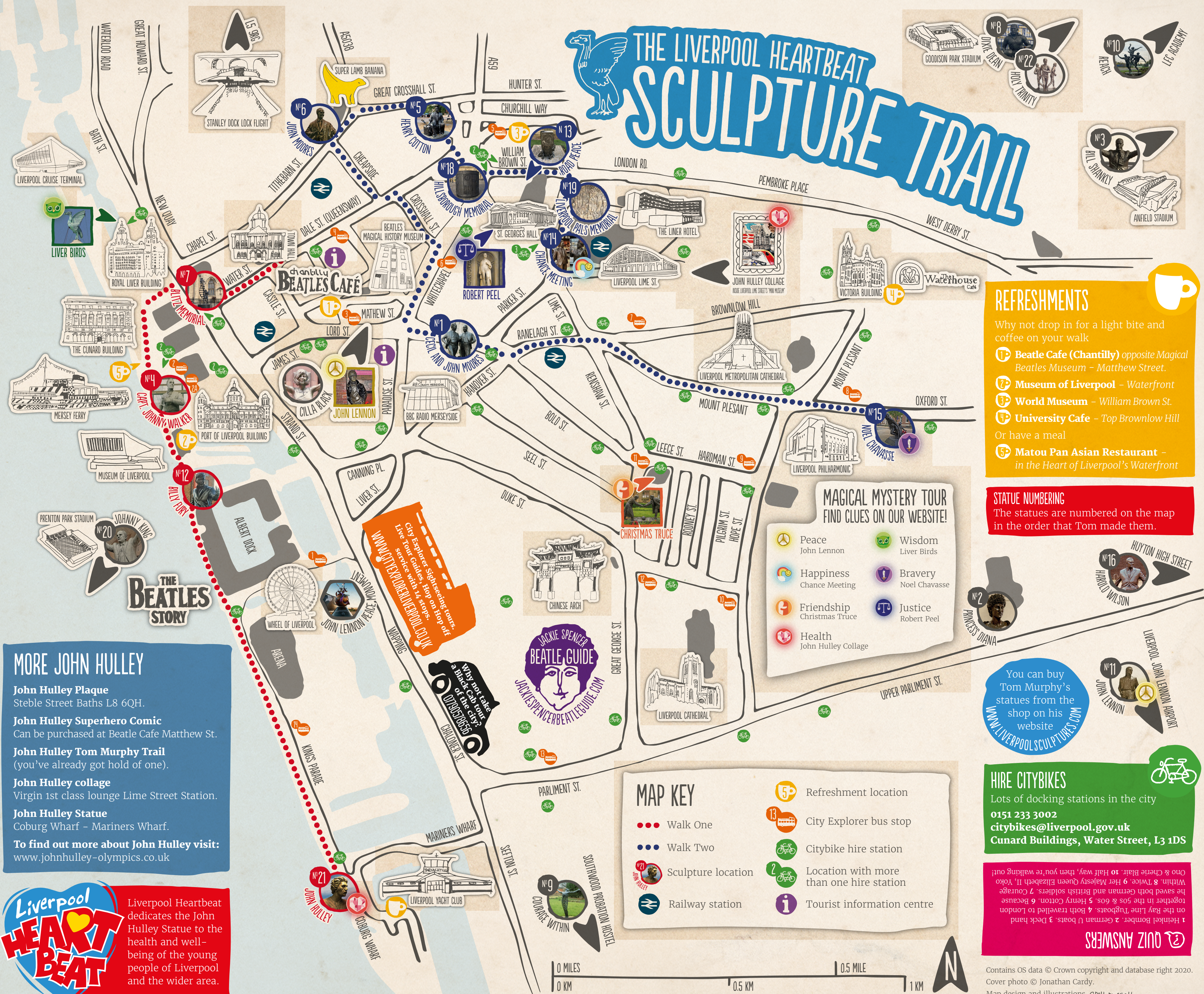
The John Hulley Legacy Events are a series of sporting events run by Liverpool Heartbeat that include many different events for all sections of the community, young and old.
