## FR. PAT'S INSIGHTS

The city of Milan in Italy is one of the most beautiful and wealthiest cities of Europe. Originally, a Celtic outpost, it would grow in prominence politically, culturally, economically, and spiritually.

Of course, like practically all European cities, it changed hands many times until it became part of the Italian consolidation in the mid-19th century.

Present day Milan is a bustling center of commerce and religious activity. It is home to the largest Catholic church in the world, the Basilica of the Santa Maria Nascente. It is one of the most magnificent and imposing Gothic churches to survive two world wars and several centuries of change. Factually speaking, it was not even completed until more than two decades after World War II and more than 600 years after construction was begun.

The imposing cathedral dominates the City and criticism and praise have both defined its imposing structure. I look forward to one day visiting this magnificent and religiously imposing Basilica, whose only architectural rivals are St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and the architectural wonder of St. Justinian the Great; Saint Sophia in Constantinople.

Milan is also known as the happiest City in the world, where the accepted mantra is to walk the medieval streets with a constant smile. The philosophy of the Milanese is to publicly display a disarming and charming smile as a sign of welcome and contentment. Nowhere in the world is this common. The question we should all ask is, "Why are they content to smile?"

Maybe they are condescending or aloof? Maybe they are sneering at the rest of us, or simply smirking? What is it they know, that we do not know? I can certainly understand and accept that they believe that the idea of joy through a simple smile is contagious rather than condescending, and disarming, rather than alarming. Maybe there is something the inhabitants of Milan know that we do not understand, and after reading about this uplifting virtue, why hasn't the rest of the world learned to exhibit this behavior and make this our psychological, physical and emotional, life quest? I wonder. Could it be so simple as understanding the principle that as Christians we all can be saved? The thought of salvation should not simply excite us, but make each and everyone of us smile.

Then again, life is not so easy even for a Christian. For us, as Orthodox Christians there is a great deal of discipline to live by. Praying, fasting, a sacramental life, spiritual illumination, belief, faith, trust..., all are inclusive and binding, but if we can succeed in accomplishing a true following, then maybe we should smile, because we know what awaits us, and it is not an end, but a new beginning.

## A SMILE IS AN INVITATION



It is not easy to smile. So often, our reality and the world around us is harsh and we are often confronted with failure. We abandon hope and work on the skill of perfecting the art of scowling. We disfigure our facial expressions, turn on one another, and even God. How can anyone smile when we separate from the Lord? Herein is our challenge. When we put on the Lord, and are imbued with the Spirit, the Lord is with us. St. Paul tells us to be one with God and the message of the Bible is that salvation is at hand. We are invited to take up the mantle, follow Jesus, and make our way toward an eternal life of bliss. Eternal life? No pain? No sorrow? No sin? This is our invitation to smile and smile broadly.

The reality of being an Orthodox Christian should point us in the right direction. We should overcome our difficulties in life by confronting them and trusting in the Lord to help us overcome them, rather than accentuate them and use them as an excuse for removing ourselves from the presence of the Lord.

Always remember, God does have a plan, and that alone should help us to smile for the Gospels remind us that the Messiah came not to destroy us, but to save us. Negativity, then, should not be allowed to impede our primary goal of living and walking with the Lord in our quest to find salvation. And for all of us who call ourselves Christian, success is a unique combination of love, forgiveness, humility, understanding, charity, and sacrifice that guide us in the direction of salvation.

The Lord, Himself is our beacon of light!

Armed with this knowledge, we should all be able to muster the strength and joy to exhibit a smile. All we need to do is to reprogram our minds and come to the realization that God does not allow us to face any situation in life which is beyond our endurance. Accepting that, we should all be able to spread the joy of life and rediscover the art of the smile.

A spiritual Father was once asked a poignant question in a discussion from his spiritual child who was searching for his faith. This individual was terribly distressed and troubled and equated his existence to living under a tempestuous cloud which never dissipated. He felt deserted, stressed out, and overwhelmed. The holy man smiled and queried, "Have you ever flown in an airplane?"

The response was quickly delivered with almost an irksome retort, "You know, Father, I fly all the time."

"Then, my son, when you rise above the clouds, which are now spread like a blanket below, what do you see?"

The answer, of course, was the clear blue sky, light and the sun. **"FIAT LUX!"** 

Our Christian strength should be drawn from this image. No matter how challenging, or disappointing, or frustrating life may seem; No matter how unbearable our pain and suffering may feel; No matter how cloudy the world appears to us, or how muddled our future may be, we need to rise above the clouds and see the Sun. Maybe then, we can all find something which has been eluding us and overcome our pains, frustrations and suffering, and rediscover the ever elusive expression which creates a very disarming atmosphere of joy and...smile.




