Sandy and her husband, Albert, renamed Brandi "Ruthie" after the late Supreme Court Justice, Ruth Bader Ginsburg. "Ruthie's definitely a Democrat!" Sandy says laughing. "When we take her to the dog park, she runs and runs, and the other dogs follow. She's definitely the leader of the pack."

When Ruthie first arrived at her new home, "She was so, so

scared," Sandy said. "She just shook and shook, but after about three days she was really comfortable. Now all she wants to do is cuddle. Ruthie also has a stubborn streak. "She wants what she wants...she just gets this look on her face." But they find themselves laughing at her antics, and have enrolled her in an obedience class.

Ruthie also enjoys the dog park, playing catch with a tennis ball and destroying her toys, even the ones marked 'indestructible.' "When people congratulate us on getting a rescue dog, we tell them that 'no, she rescued us'," Sandy says. "We *love*, *love*, *love* her!"

the world for more than a year.

The past year has been interesting, to say the least. The temporary shutdown of our thrift store, spay/ neuter clinic and adoption program last spring; the move to an online adoption application process in June; and the reopening of our clinic in November brought challenges at every turn. But, thanks to your generosity, we've emerged stronger than ever, and are ready to help pets and pet owners face their own challenges in a changed world.

So, what are some of these challenges?

A big one is the increased need for veterinary care. As the pandemic raged, shelters around the country were cleared out as people sought the companionship of a pet. Many other rescues leave spays and neuters up to the adopters, which means our clinic has been busy, altering nearly 600 cats and dogs just since November! There's also an increased need for basic wellness care in our community, and we plan to increase these services in 2021.

Many wonder whether, after the rash of pandemic adoptions, there will be a flood of animals dumped in shelters as people return to their offices. Fortunately, we haven't seen that yet, and I hope we don't. But if it happens, I promise that together, we'll be there to help, just as we were for the animals you'll read about in this newsletter. Thank you for being there, right along with us.


Finn the 'Flying Torpedo'
