## FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

#### **INTROIT** Ps. 26:7, 9

Hear, O Lord, the sound of my call; be my helper: forsake me not: despise me not, O God my Saviour. *Ps 26:1* The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom should I fear?

#### COLLECT

O God, You Who have prepared good things as yet unseen for those who love You, pour a burning love into our hearts, so that we, loving You in and above all things, may obtain Your promises which surpass all desire.

#### **EPISTLE** 1 Pet 3:8-15.

Beloved: Be all like-minded in prayer, compassionate, lovers of the brethren, merciful, reserved, humble; not rendering evil for evil, or abuse for abuse, but contrariwise, blessing; for unto this were you called that you might inherit a blessing. For, 'He who would love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no deceit. Let him turn away from evil and do good, let him seek after peace and pursue it. For the eyes of the Lord are upon the just, and His ears unto their prayers; but the face of the Lord is against those who do evil.' And who is there to harm you, if you are zealous for what is good? But even if you suffer anything for justice' sake, blessed are you. So have no fear of their fear and do not be troubled. But hallow the Lord Christ in your hearts.

Behold, O God, our protector, and look on Your servants. O Lord God of Hosts, hear the prayers of Your servants. Alleluia, alleluia.

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Unless your justice exceeds that of the Scribes and Pharisees, you shall not enter the kingdom of heaven. You have heard that it was said to the ancients, 'You shall not kill'; and that whoever shall kill shall be liable to judgment. But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgment; and whoever says to his

brother, 'Raca,' shall be liable to the Sanhedrin; and whoever says, 'You fool!', shall be liable to the fire of Gehenna. Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift before the altar and go first to be reconciled to your brother; and then come and offer your gift.

#### **SECRET**

Be propitious to our supplications, O Lord, and graciously receive these oblations of Your servants and handmaids, that what each one offered to the glory of Your name, may profit all to salvation.

#### PREFACE OF THE HOLY TRINITY

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God; Who, together with Thine only-begotten Son, and the Holy Ghost, art one God, one Lord: not in the oneness of a single Person, but in the Trinity of one substance. For what we believe by Thy revelation of Thy glory, the same do we believe of Thy Son, the same of the Holy Ghost, without difference or separation. So that in confessing the true and everlasting Godhead, distinction in persons, unity in essence, and equality in majesty may be adored. Which the Angels and Archangels, the Cherubim also and Seraphim do praise: who cease not daily to cry out, with one voice saying:

#### COMMUNION Ps. 26:4.

One thing I ask of the Lord; this I seek: to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

#### POST COMMUNION

Grant us, we beseech You, O Lord, that we whom You have filled with the heavenly gift may be cleansed of our hidden sins and delivered from the snares of our enemies.



# CONFRATERNITY OF THE BROWN SCAPULAR

"Whoever dies invested with this Scapular shall be preserved from the eternal flames. It is a sign of salvation, a sure safeguard in danger, a pledge of peace and of my special protection until the end of the ages."

- Promise of Our Lady to St. Simon Stock on July 16, 1251

All the Catholic faithful should be invested in the Scapular, thereby automatically becoming a member of the Confraternity of the Brown Scapular. This means one has the privilege of being affiliated with the Carmelite Order, participating in the merits of the Carmelite Fathers and Religious in life and in death, as well as receiving the promises of Our Lady through the Scapular.

Conditions to receiving the promises of Our Lady:

- 1. Be invested in the Scapular by a priest. The Church has given permission to all priests to invest the faithful in the Scapular.
- 2. Observe exactly what has been prescribed regarding material, color, and shape of the Scapular.
- 3. To wear the Scapular continuously as possible as a sign of one's consecration. The Scapular should not be removed out of vanity or whenever it is not convenient to wear it.

We must understand that by wearing the Scapular we show our complete consecration and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and all invested are encouraged to pray the Rosary daily.

It is no longer an obligation upon the lay faithful to send in names of those invested. If your Brown Scapular becomes worn out or breaks, you do not need to be invested again. Simply obtain a new Scapular and begin wearing it—the original blessing and investiture remain valid, as the blessing is predominantly conferred upon the person invested in the Scapular. When disposing of a worn or broken Scapular, it should be burned (and then the ashes buried) or simply buried.


## Introduction to the Devout Life by St. Francis de Sales

PART III. CONTAINING COUNSELS CONCERNING THE PRACTICE OF VIRTUE.

CHAPTER XI. On Obedience. (Continued)

There are two kinds of obedience, one necessary, the other voluntary. The first includes a humble obedience to your ecclesiastical superiors, whether Pope, Bishop, Curate, or those commissioned by them. You are likewise bound to obey your civil superiors, king and magistrates; as also your domestic superiors, father, mother, master or mistress. Such obedience is called necessary, because no one can free himself from the duty of obeying these superiors, God having appointed them severally to bear rule over us. Therefore do you obey their commands as of right, but if you would be perfect, follow their counsels, and even their wishes as far as charity and prudence will allow: obey as to things acceptable; as when they bid you eat, or take recreation, for although there may be no great virtue in obedience in such a case, there is great harm in disobedience. Obey in things indifferent, as concerning questions of dress, coming and going, singing or keeping silence, for herein is a very laudable obedience. Obey in things hard, disagreeable and inconvenient, and therein lies a very perfect obedience. Moreover, obey quietly, without answering again, promptly, without delay, cheerfully, without reluctance; and, above all, render a loving obedience for His Sake Who became obedient even to the death of the Cross for our sake; Who, as Saint Bernard says, chose rather to resign His Life than His Obedience.
