



Sundays: During Mass (when 2nd priest is available). Daily: 30 minutes prior to Mass; Wednesday: 7-8PM;

Church Open for Prayer

Monday-Thursday, Saturday: 7:30AM-4:00PM; Friday: 12:00-7:00PM.

Infant Baptism: Within a month of birth. Contact the pastor prior to due date. A letter of good standing is required for a godparent from his pastor. The baptismal name must be taken from a saint.

Converts: 6-12 months of instruction with a priest. Contact the pastor.

Marriage: Preceded by a minimum of 6 months of marriage preparation with a priest.

Funerals: Please contact the pastor to arrange all funerals.

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT *Ps 85:1-3*

Incline Your ear, O Lord; answer me; save Your servant, O my God, who trusts in You. Have pity on me, O Lord, for to You I call all the day. *Ps 85:4* Gladden the soul of Your servant, for to You, O Lord, I lift up my soul.

COLLECT

May Your abiding mercy, O Lord, cleanse and strengthen Your Church, and, since without You she cannot exist in safety, let her be ever guided by Your grace.

EPISTLE *Gal* 5:25-26; 6:1-10

Brethren: If we live by the Spirit, by the Spirit let us also walk. Let us not become desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, even if a person is caught doing something wrong, you who are spiritual instruct such a one in a spirit of meekness, considering yourself, lest you also be tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and so you will fulfill the law of Christ. For if anyone thinks himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceives himself. But let everyone test his own work, and so he will have glory in himself only, and not in comparison with another. For each one will bear his own burden. And let him who is instructed in the word share all good things with his teacher. Be not deceived, God is not mocked. For what a man sows in the flesh, from the flesh also will reap corruption. But he who sows in the spirit, from the spirit will reap life everlasting. And in doing good let us not grow tired; for in due time we shall reap if we do not relax. Therefore, while we have time, let us do good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of faith.

It is good to give thanks to the Lord, to sing to Your name, Most High. *V.* To proclaim Your kindness at dawn and Your faithfulness throughout the night. Alleluia, alleluia. *Ps 94:3 V.* For the Lord is a great God, and a great King over all the earth. Alleluia.

At that time, Jesus went to a town called Naim; and His disciples and a large crowd went with Him. And as He drew near the gate of the town, behold, a dead man was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow; and a large gathering from the town was with her. The bread that I will give is My Flesh for the life of the world.


POST COMMUNION


