

Blessed Palms and Other Items

Blessed palms — and any other blessed items — will not be collected at the church this year. As a reminder, blessed objects are to be treated with reverence. When disposing of any blessed item, it should be burned (and the ashes buried) or simply buried. Blessed items should not be brought to the church and should never be discarded in the trash.

EPISTLE *1 Cor. 13:1-13*

Brethren: If I should speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but do not have charity, I have become as sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal. And if I have prophecy and know all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith so as to remove mountains, yet do not have charity, I am nothing. And if I distribute all my goods to feed the poor, and if I deliver my body to be burned, yet do not have charity, it profits me nothing. Charity is patient, is kind; charity does not envy, is not pretentious, is not puffed up, is not ambitious, is not self-seeking, is not provoked; thinks no evil, does not rejoice over wickedness, but rejoices with the truth; bears with all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Charity never fails, whereas prophecies will disappear, and tongues will cease, and knowledge will be destroyed. For we know in part and we prophesy in part; but when that which is perfect has come, that which is imperfect will be done away with. When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I felt as a child, I thought as a child. Now that I have become a man, I have put away the things of a child. We see now through a mirror in an obscure manner, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know even as I have been known. So there abide faith, hope and charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity.

GOSPEL *Luke 18:31-43*

At that time, Jesus taking to Himself the Twelve said to them, Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and all things that have been written by the prophets concerning the Son of Man will be accomplished. For He will be delivered to the Gentiles, and will be mocked and scourged and spit upon; and after they have scourged Him, they will put Him to death; and on the third day He will rise again. FAST AND ABSTINENCE

All Faithful are reminded that Ash Wednesday and
Good Friday are days of obligatory fast and absti-
nence, and that Fridays of Lent are obligatory days
of abstinence.

Fasting is the taking of only one full meal and two
smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal.
No eating between meals is permitted, though liq-
uids may be taken at any time. The current Code of
Canon Law sets the fasting obligation for those 18
to 59 years old.

Abstinence is refraining from eating the meat of
mammals or fowl, as well as soups or gravies made
from them (fish is allowed). Traditionally, the law of
abstinence applied from age 7 onward; under the
current Code of Canon Law, the obligation begins
at age 14.
