

For this is the will of God, your sanctification; that you abstain from immorality; that every one of you learn how to possess his vessel in holiness and honor, not in the passion of lust like the Gentiles who do not know God; that no one transgress and overreach his brother in the matter, because the Lord is the avenger of all these things, as we have told you before and have testified. For God has not called us unto uncleanness, but unto holiness, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

At that time, Jesus took Peter, James and his brother John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves, and was transfigured before them. And His face shone as the sun, and His garments became white as snow. And behold, there appeared to them Moses and Elias

## FAST AND ABSTINENCE

All Faithful are reminded that Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of obligatory fast and abstinence, and that Fridays of Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

Fasting is the taking of only one full meal and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal. No eating between meals is permitted, though liquids may be taken at any time. The current Code of Canon Law sets the fasting obligation for those 18 to 59 years old.

Abstinence is refraining from eating the meat of mammals or fowl, as well as soups or gravies made from them (fish is allowed). Traditionally, the law of abstinence applied from age 7 onward; under the current Code of Canon Law, the obligation begins at age 14.
