

THE PRESENCE OF GOD:

A Lenten Mission with the Dominicans of the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas of Rome

March 6-8, 2023

Mon, March 6: Divine Providence Tues, March 7: Divine Indwelling Wed, March 8: His Real Presence

This parish mission will help you and your families to more easily see the Presence of God in your lives. The Lord is always at work, but we frequently fail to see Him or even notice Him. The first night is about *Divine Providence*, the second night is about the *Divine Indwelling* (how the Lord lives in the tabernacle of our souls) and the third night is about *His Real Presence* in the gift of the Eucharist and His healing power to transform families.

The Dominican friars want to reach out, in particular, to all the men of your parish, to lift them up in their vocation as husbands/fathers and to bring special healing and blessings to families. The mission finds its culmination in a powerful Eucharistic Healing Service for families on Wednesday night. Since the Lord is kind and merciful, the friars will have extended hours on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday for the Sacrament of Confession allowing everyone to repent of their sins before the Wednesday evening healing service. The grace of the sacrament of confession and extra prayers for your families will prepare each person/family to be touched in a special way during the Wednesday evening Eucharistic Healing Service.

Each father/man will receive a *special blessing* and anointing with the miraculous Oil of Saint Joseph from Saint Joseph's Oratory in Montreal, where Saint André Bessette would burn oil below a statue of Saint Joseph, and anoint people with it. Many miracles, both spiritual and physical, have taken place over the years. Saint Joseph is the special protector of our families and the Church - we should go to him often! (All participants, women, men and children will be anointed with the Oil of Saint Joseph.)

After being blessed and anointed with miraculous oil by a priest, each person and family will have a special moment of close adoration of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. If your family is not around or unable/unwilling to come to the mission, you can bring a photo of them, and "stand-in" for them to pray for healing for your family. If you have members of your family for whom you are praying, these days of mission will be a special opportunity to ask the Lord to restore/heal families.

Since one does not need to be Catholic to participate in the mission or the Wednesday healing service, small cards promoting the mission will be available to pass out to anyone whom you would like to personally invite who may have a special need for healing or God's Mercy. This mission will also be an opportunity for evangelization for your parish.

Everywhere the Dominicans have preached this mission, we have seen tremendous graces and blessings! Why? Because it is the Lord who touches hearts through His Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament. The morning & evening talks (same message) are done in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

The Dominican Friars look forward to coming and sharing the Grace and Healing of Jesus Christ with each of you and your families! Families with little children will be given the opportunity to come forward first on Wednesday evening, so they can get the little ones home to bed.

Adult Confirmation

For baptized Catholics who have received First Holy Communion but lack Confirmation, a preparation class is offered in the Fall at St. Michael the Archangel and in the Spring at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart. Before attending, you must first register by filling out the inquiry form on the church website.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is for adults who, after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. By God's help, they will be strengthened spiritually during their preparation and eventually will receive the sacraments fruitfully.

Registration and a meeting with Mary Caprio are required in order to begin this process. To register, please go to <u>stmichaelchurch.net/rcia</u>. RCIA is a gradual process that takes place within the community of the faithful:

- The Period of Evangelization and Inquiry: A time of inquiry and introduction to Gospel values, an opportunity for the beginnings of faith. Emphasis is on stories in Scriptures, Church, parish, and life of the individual and begins immersion into the parish.
- The Catechumenate: A time for the nurturing and growth of the catechumen's faith and conversion to God.
- Purification and Enlightenment: Immediately prior to initiation, an intense spiritual preparation, focused on interior reflection.
- Mystagogy: A time for community and neophytes together to grow in deepening their grasp of the paschal mystery and making it part of their lives.

The Children Faith Formation ministry partners with parents as they teach their children to know and love their Catholic faith. Our programs are for children in preschool (age 4) through fifth grade and include Sunday Faith Formation, Home School Faith Formation, and Sacrament Preparation. Sunday Faith Formation & Home School Faith Formation

Our hybrid program encourages children and parents to grow together in learning our Catholic faith! We partner with you to enrich your child's catechesis. Our program includes 50% on-campus, in-person classes with the remaining 50% as parent-taught home school lessons. In our Faith Formation program, children in pre-K4 through fifth grade learn about their Catholic faith through a curriculum that focuses on knowing Jesus and discipleship. We encourage families to enroll their children in faith formation at every age.

Sacrament Preparation

The Children Faith Formation ministry partners with parents to prepare their children to celebrate God's forgiveness in First Reconciliation and to receive Jesus in First Eucharist. Second grade students must be in their second continuous year of Faith Formation at St. Michael or in their second continuous year of religion classes in a Catholic school and baptized in the Catholic faith.

At 9:00 am on the first Sunday of selected months during the school year, children participate as lectors, gift bearers, and choir members. They are also invited to the altar to listen to the homily.

Confirmation preparation for youth is a process which requires two consecutive years of catechesis. This may be completed through attendance and participation in our Confirmation Year 1 program or Catholic high school. The second year must be completed through the parish (Confirmation Prep Year 2).

These two years of preparation work together to provide the Confirmandi with a profound relationship with Jesus Christ, an encouraging and welcoming community at St. Michael, and a connection with the Catholic Church as a whole.

The teen wishing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and their parents must attend an informational meeting. In addition, the candidate for Confirmation must attend a Confirmation retreat during their final year of preparation and complete acts of service.

Confirmation FAQs

My child's school has mandatory retreats every year. Can this count for their Confirmation Retreat?

No, the local schools do not offer a Confirmation specific retreat. If a child
is unable to attend with St. Michael, they may attend with another parish
on their Confirmation Retreat.

Does Life Teen replace or counts towards my child's Confirmation preparation?

No, it does not count or replace Confirmation preparation. Life Teen is an
optional program where teens can come, build community, have fun and
a place to discuss and ask any questions about their faith. This program
is designed to meet the youth where they're at even after Confirmation.


My child does service hours for school, could he volunteer at a school function for his/her Confirmation hours?

 Yes, our Confirmation hours are broken down in 3 categories... Mass hours, Parish/Community hours and Adoration hours. Your child can volunteer at a school function for their community hours BUT are still required to complete some of those at the parish to build community.





Parents preparing to baptize a child under 6 years old must be able to give assurance that their child will be raised in the practice of the Catholic faith. Through baptism, parents are accepting the responsibility of gifting their Catholic faith to their child.

Prior to presenting their child for Baptism, parents and godparent(s) should attend a baptismal preparation class. Requirements for choosing godparents for your child are listed in the "Godparents" section of our website. Baptismal preparation class at St. Michael is valid for 4 years.

Mothers, we recommend that you and your party attend the preparation session in your 2nd or 3rd trimester of pregnancy so that there is plenty of time to get everything in order.
