

Inquietum Cor 001, Jan. 8-11, 2026

Builds on lessons learned from Jan, 2025 Immaculata Conference, which was attended by about 500 (400 students, 70 adults and 30 religious)

- With more planning and earlier communications, over 1000 students is feasible
- The retreat approach is one that has value, but that value could be increased by holding the event in Sacred spaces
- Some religious have the charism to lead and to speak, and some do not
- Service should be integrated, moving focus from "self care" to "care for others"
- Less "talking at" and more "doing with"


