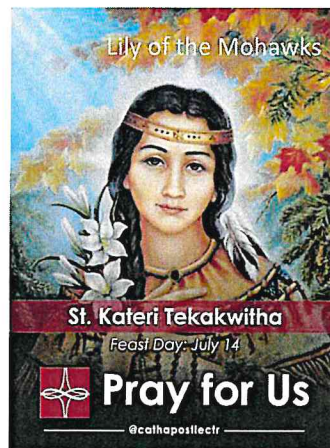

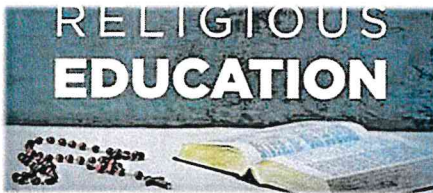

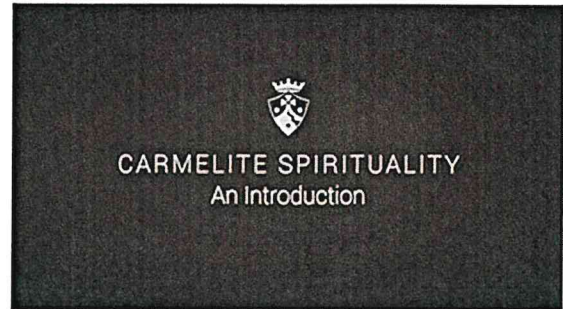
**2025-2026 RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION**
