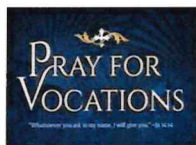

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION



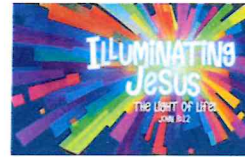
Our annual Corpus Christi Procession is scheduled for **Sunday, June 7th following the 11:15 Mass.** More details will follow in upcoming bulletins.

SAINT SPOTLIGHT Saint Christopher Magallanes, Martyr



He was born Cristóbal Magallanes Jara July 30, 1869 in San Rafael, Totatiche, Jalisco, Mexico. He was ordained a priest in 1899 and he died May 25, 1927 (aged 57) in Colotlán, Jalisco, Mexico. His Feast day is May 21st. Beatified on November 22, 1992 by Pope John Paul II and Canonized on May 21, 2000 by Pope John Paul II.

Attributes: Cassock, sacerdotal vestments, Bible, rosary, and palm of martyrdom. Patron Saint of Cancer.

All are invited to attend an **End-of-Life Seminar event on Saturday, July 25, from 9 am-1 pm, at the Diocesan Center (4800 Union Deposit Rd., Harrisburg). The seminar will be presented by Dr. Joseph Meaney, PhD, KM, and Mr. Paul T. Schemel, Esq., DSS Law.**

Dr. Joseph Meaney is Past President and Senior Ethicist of the National Catholic Bioethics Center, who will share informative guidance to support our understanding and preparation for end-of-life issues. End-of-Life care and decision making are vitally important topics for almost everyone. Catholics frequently have a different ethical perspective from mainstream society and there are real dangers to accepting advanced directive advice from some medical/legal professionals. Preparation for Eternal Life has always been a paramount concern of the Church, and biomedical and legal changes make that more complicated than ever before. [Mr. Paul T.
