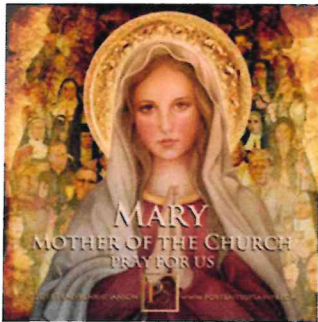
**THE ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS**

**Pentecost**, from the Greek word pentēkostē meaning "fiftieth," is celebrated 50 days after Easter Sunday and commemorates the moment when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus (Acts 2:1-4). This event empowered them to preach the Gospel boldly and initiated the Church's mission to all nations, making Pentecost often referred to as the "birthday of the Church".



**SAINT SPOTLIGHT Mary Mother of the Church**



The theological roots of this title go back to the early Church. The Fathers of the Church, holy and studious bishops of the first centuries, often spoke of Mary as the New Eve. Just as the Woman Eve was "the mother of all the living" (Genesis 3:20), the Woman Mary was the mother of all those living in Christ. In Revelation 12:17, St. John says that this

Woman's offspring are "those who keep the commandments of God and bear testimony to Jesus." -EWTN

The Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church is celebrated the Monday after Pentecost.
