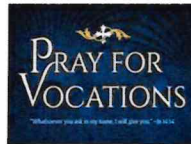

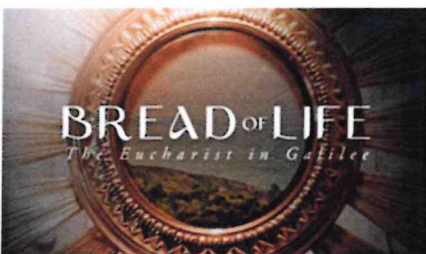
FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

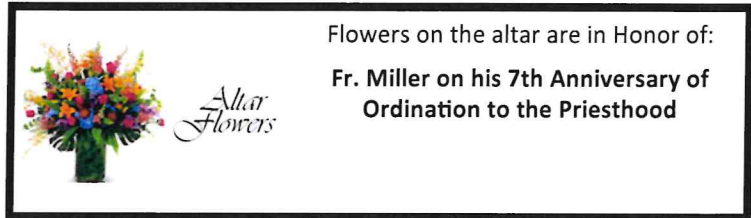

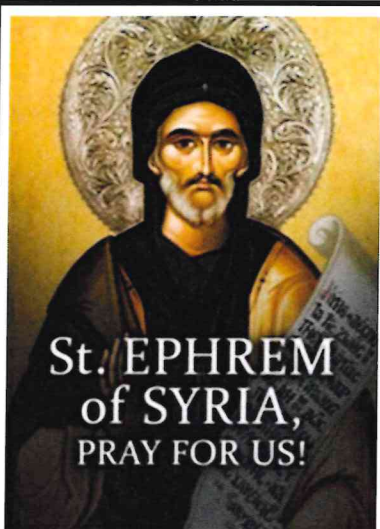

SAINT SPOTLIGHT St. Ephrem, Deacon & Doctor of the Church Ephrem the Syrian was a 4th-century Syriac Christian theologian, deacon, and prolific hymnographer revered across Eastern and Western traditions as the “Harp of the Holy Spirit.” Born in Nisibis around 306, he later settled in Edessa after Persian conquest. Renowned for over 400 surviving hymns, biblical commentaries, and poetic homilies, he defended Nicene orthodoxy, refuted heresies, and pioneered using popular melodies for theological teaching. Declared a Doctor of the Church in 1920, his works

remain central to Syriac Christianity. - 5 sources
