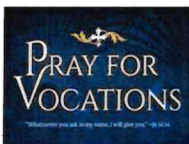

SAINT SPOTLIGHT

St. Romuald, Abbott c. 951–1027

Invoked for reformation of the Church and monastic life Canonized by Pope Gregory XIII in 1582. As a young man he was recognized as being mischievous, even mean. After witnessing his father kill a relative during a duel over land, he escaped to a Benedictine Monastery to atone for his father's sin. He decided to stay and become a monk. After many years of traditional actions of silence and prayer, he traveled Europe opening new traditional monasteries.

Happy Flag Day!!

Flag day, June 14th is the date in 1777 when a design was approved for the First National Flag of the United States and in 1916 Pres. Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14th as the official date for Flag Day, and in 1949 the U.S. Congress permanently established the date as National Flag Day. Although Flag Day is not an official federal holiday, Pennsylvania celebrates the day as a state holiday. Each year the U.S. president delivers an address that proclaims the week of June 14th as National Flag Week, and all Americans are encouraged to fly "Old Glory" during the week. - Britannica
