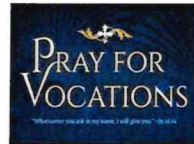

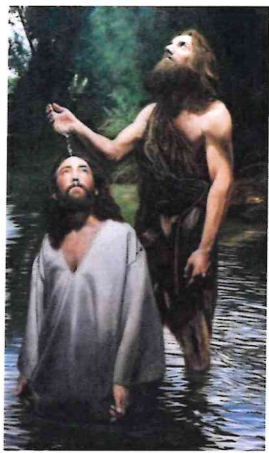
2026-2027 RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

SAINT SPOTLIGHT St. John the Baptist

St. John the Baptist is one of the few saints whose birth, rather than death, is celebrated by the Church, alongside Jesus Christ and the Virgin Mary (December 25 and September 8, respectively). His feast day is set on June 24th, exactly six months before Christmas, reflecting the Gospel of Luke, which notes that John was born six months before Jesus. This timing also aligns with the summer solstice, symbolically representing John's words: "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30), highlighting his role as the forerunner of Christ. catholicmenofamerica.com
