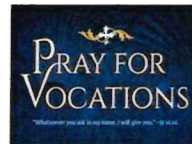

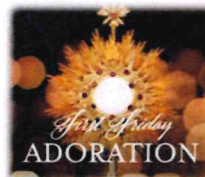

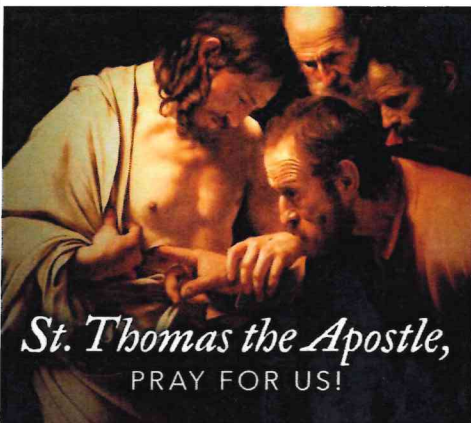


2026-2027 RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

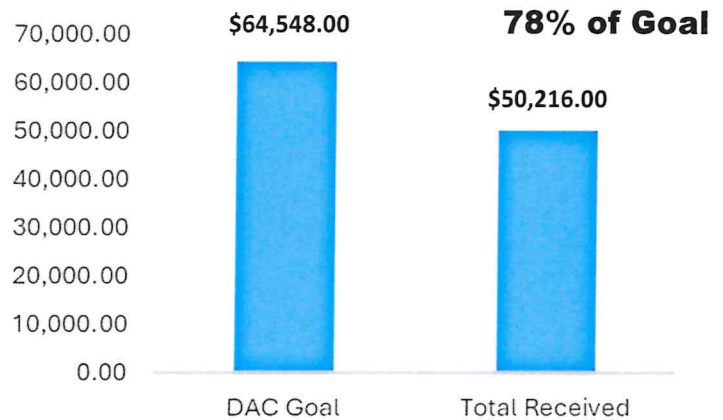
