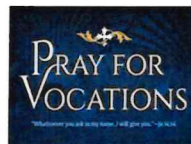

SAINT SPOTLIGHT - ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA



Inigo de Loyola was born in northern Spain in 1491. He was the youngest of 13 children. At the age of 16 he was a page for the treasurer of the kingdom of Castile and became smitten with the material world. Later he became a soldier but sustained a wound in battle. A cannon ball had broken his leg. While bedridden for a year because of his injury he read many books on the life of Christ and of the saints. At this time he noticed that God was working in him. So in 1522 he left home, he gave away his worldly goods and began a life as a pilgrim. While

living in a cave outside of town he began to write his Spiritual Exercises (compilation of prayers, meditations and prayer practices). Ignatius went back to school and became a priest. Later he and six others including (Francis Xavier & Peter Tabor) formed the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits). The Jesuits like other Orders take the vows of poverty, chastity & obedience. But they also take a vow of obedience to their Pope. Ignatius wrote over 7,000 letters in his lifetime. He suffered from stomach ailments most of his life and on July 31, 1556 he died from his illness. He is the patron Saint of education, retreats, soldiers & The Society of Jesus. He was canonized on the same day as his friend Francis Xavier, March 12, 1622.

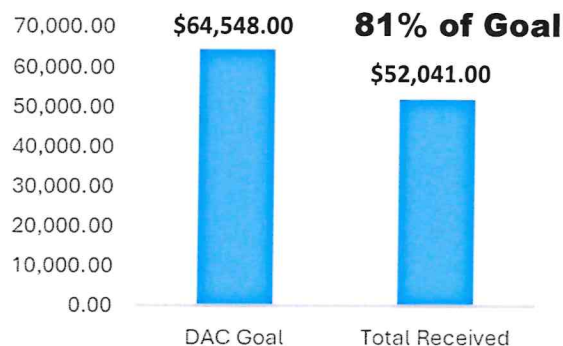

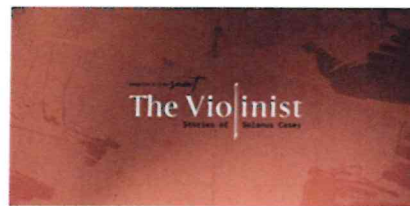
