God's Covenant with Noah

For behold, I will bring a flood of waters upon the earth to destroy all flesh in which is the breath of life under heaven. Everything that is on the earth shall die. ¹⁸ But I will establish my covenant with you, and you shall come into the ark, you, your sons, your wife, and your sons' wives with you.
—Genesis 6:17-18

In our exploration of Covenant Theology, last month, we saw that, after the entrance of sin into the world, the whole biblical story is one of God's Covenant of Grace. The Covenants of the Old Testament are all *gracious* covenants by which God gives ahead-of-time the very same salvation that Jesus would one day accomplish.

Westminster Confession of Faith 7.5 tells us that “[The one Covenant of Grace] was differently administered in the time of the law [the Old Testament], and in the time of the Gospel: *under the law it was administered by promises, prophecies, sacrifices, circumcision, the paschal lamb, and other types and ordinances delivered to the people of the Jews, all foreshadowing Christ to come.*” It was the same covenant though known and experienced in different ways.

In Genesis 3:15 God's salvation promise was introduced. The next great appearance of God's salvation appears with Noah. In fact, Genesis 6:17 (above) is special because it is the very first place in Scripture that “covenant” (Hebrew: *berît*) is explicitly mentioned. It is notable though that God says he is “establishing” his covenant with Noah. The Hebrew word does not indicate that God is making something *new*. Instead, it is about *confirming* something that already exists. This is the first mention of “covenant” in Scripture. But it assumes that God's gracious covenant already exists with his people. The covenant with Noah thus points to the unity of God's saving work. He confirms with Noah what he has already promised to do with Adam and Eve.

The covenant is clearly gracious. Before introducing the covenant, Genesis tells us about God's plan to destroy the wicked world. It then says: “But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD” (Gen 6:9).

As a result, Noah and his family receive promises and experience a salvation that powerfully “foreshadows” Christ to come.



In the beginning, God formed the world by blowing with his wind/Spirit over the deep waters of chaos (Gen 1:2). He placed boundaries upon the seas in order to make dry land and provide space for life to flourish (Gen 1:9–10). By sending a flood, God undoes his original creative work. He allows the waters of chaos to once again cover the creation. The flood waters are a fitting image of God's judgment.

But what do we find? God rescues Noah from that wicked world that stands under his judgment. God brings the flood to an end, and he does so by once again blowing with his Spirit, pushing back the chaotic waters, creating dry land. God gives a kind of *new creation* (8:1). The new creation even includes a moment of Sabbath “rest” in the seventh month (8:4). And it comes with a renewed commission to “be fruitful and multiply” (9:1).

All of this points so powerfully to Christ's future work as redeemer. The Apostle Peter describes this most directly. In 2 Peter 3:6–7, he speaks about Noah's flood as anticipating the righteous judgment that God will bring upon the world on the last day. But, elsewhere, he also describes Noah's experience as one of "salvation." Noah's family was kept safe within the ark and brought through the storm of God's judgment. Peter says the same reality is pictured for us in baptism. In baptism, we

see how Christ saves us by bringing us through the waters of God's judgment (1 Peter 3:20–21). What a powerful assurance that the God who has made covenant promises will also be faithful to remember his promises. He will bring us safely through.

Games assistance: There are activities scheduled outside for the various age levels. This team would assist in describing the activities to the children and supervising the participation. The children love a little playtime outside to release some of their energy!

All I remember is that at the end of the first day, I sat there in my plaid pleated skirt and white blouse with Peter Pan collar and my hair pulled back in a Tortoise shell headband watching with bated breath for the black-and-white clock on the wall to strike three. When the bell rang, I ran all the way home.

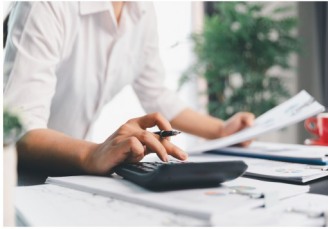
That moment is seared in my memory. To love someone or something that much, and for life to be so over-the-top. The excitement waiting for me. The joy of it all. I know we all think it is wonderful to be loved, but I think it's more wonderful to love. I never felt so alive. What a gift from God.

PSA - New Tax for Charitable Giving

Starting in **2026**, a new federal tax law allows people who take the standard deduction to **deduct charitable donations**—something many haven't been able to do in recent years. Individuals may deduct up to **\$1,000**, and married couples up to **\$2,000**, for **cash gifts** made to Covenant Presbyterian Church.

Divine Intervention

A few months ago, I boarded an airplane in Vegas and took the window seat. Next stop was Hawaii. I watched a large, black man walk down the aisle. Upon reaching my row, he asked if he could sit with me. "My wife will soon arrive and take the middle seat, but the aisle seat is all yours," I replied. His wife was with him, but due to his size, she advised him to take the exit row alongside me instead of sitting with her.

He immediately introduced himself and shook my hand. When told I lived in Omaha, he said, "I lived in Nebraska from 1969-1973." "Why only four years?" I asked. "Those were the years I attended college. I was a starting defensive lineman for the Cornhuskers. We were national champions. You remember those teams?" "Oh my gosh!" I shouted. "Do I remember them? Johnny the Jet Rodgers, Jerry Tagge, Jeff Kinney, Larry Jacobsen, Rich Glover! They were the best team ever! And you were on that team?" I was in awe.

He told me countless stories about coach Bob Devaney, locker room antics, the bowl games, the key to their success and more. Many members of the team get together annually and he showed me pictures on his phone of their reunions.

During our conversation he said, "You're a doctor, aren't you?" I stared at him in disbelief. Not once had I mentioned anything about myself other than where I lived. I had no medical journals on my lap. "How did you know that?" I asked. "I have a gift. I can discern a lot about a person simply by talking to and watching them. I also know you're a Christian."

"You're a prophet," I said.

We had the greatest conversation on the six hour flight. I hoped it would never end.

When landing in Hawaii, he stood to exit the plane. He gripped my hand again but did not release it this time. He stared at me for a few seconds and finally said, "You need to retire and take time to enjoy your amazing wife, your life, and your mission work." I smiled. He didn't. He continued to stare at me until I realized how serious he was. He finally released my hand.

I had my first paying job (not an allowance) at age seven and have worked non-stop since. For the past two decades I've had four jobs each and every year. I love working. I'd thought of retirement, but not seriously. Not until I met this man. I couldn't shake the look he gave me as he held my hand at the end of the

flight. Somehow, he knew I was a physician and a Christian. I couldn't ignore his recommendation.

I finally started praying, asking the Lord if I should retire. I was amazed at the quick reply. The answer was clear and obvious. After 36 years, I'll retire from Emergency Medicine on December 31, 2026.

I went from rarely thinking about retirement to anxiously anticipating it. Every day my phone tells me how many days, hours, minutes, and seconds until my final shift. How did this change of heart occur so suddenly?



The only answer I have is because of the man Christ placed on the same plane, in the same row as myself. This divine intervention now has me joyfully planning my future. Taking theology classes online from BIOLA (Bible Institute of Los Angeles) University, riding my bike in as many states as possible, extending my mission trips, spending more time with family, and for the first time in 3 plus decades, sleeping every night in my own bed.

I wonder if Christ said, "You've worked long enough, earned enough money, neglected too many priorities, and thus I will make this easy for you."

Divine intervention is God intervening in the affairs of the world. He changed my life on a flight across the Pacific, and I can't be more thankful. I ask for more divine interventions on a daily basis. What have I got to lose? How about you?

Proverbs 1:9 – "In their hearts, humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps."

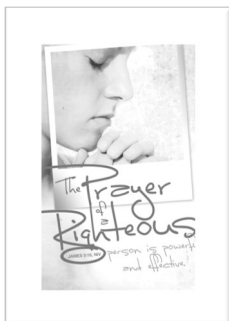
