God's Covenant with Moses

I call heaven and earth to witness against you today, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and curse. Therefore choose life, that you and your offspring may live.

Deuteronomy 30:19

In our consideration of God's Covenant of Grace, we arrive at the Mosaic Covenant. God's Covenant with Moses is complicated. Like an onion—it has layers. One of the ways to appreciate the Mosaic Covenant is to consider its *historical* foundation, its *present* provision, and its *future* promise.

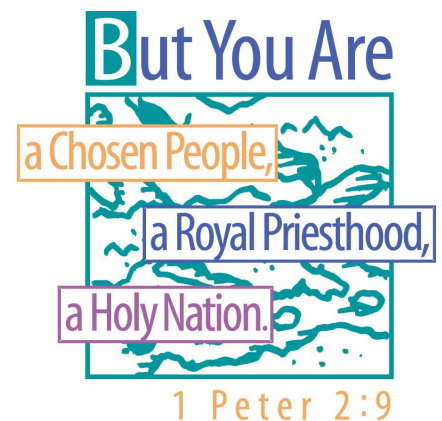
On the one hand, the Covenant with Moses looks back. It rests on the past promises that God had made with Abraham. And it rests on God's mighty works to bring those promises about. When God came to Moses, he said "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob" (Exodus 3:6). God hears the cry of the Israelites in Egypt and comes, "to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land" (Exodus 3:8). In other words, God, through Moses, acts to begin to fulfill his covenant promises to the Patriarchs. So, the Covenant with Moses rests on what came before. We can see the unity of God's covenants.

The Covenant with Moses also offers something distinct—a present provision for the unique Mosaic era. At Sinai, God enters into a formal covenant relationship with Israel in such a way that the *family* of God become *the nation* of God *under God's law*. Moses explains all of God's law, and the people respond together, "All the words that the LORD has spoken we will do" (Exodus 24:3). In the time of Moses, it continues to be true for each individual Israelite that they belong to God and are saved by God only by his grace and through faith in his promises. Yet, on top of reality is placed another national reality. The nation, if

they obey, will experience God's blessing. If they disobey, they will experience God's curse. As a result, Israel as a nation becomes like a new Adam. They are placed in God's land—a new Eden. They are given God's command and obedience to the command would bring life, disobedience will bring death. Like the original Adam, Israel eventually failed and experienced exile and death. In this way, in the era of the Mosaic Covenant, God ordained that his people would become a living illustration of humanity's ongoing need for a Second Adam.

The problem, of course, was not with God's law. Israel celebrates God's law. God's law is holy and righteous and good (Rom 7:12). The problem was with the human heart and with the dominion of sin in our world.

For this reason, the Mosaic Covenant also *looked forward* to a time when God would address humanity's sin-and-heart problem. Throughout the Mosaic Covenant are pictures—a Passover Lamb whose blood is given to accomplish redemption, sacrifices that promise atonement for sin and fellowship with God, feasts which look back and look forward to the day of God's deliverance. The Mosaic Covenant, as a Covenant of Grace, was filled with pictures to assure God's people that one day the true Adam and the true deliverer would come.

We live on the far side of those promises *and* still awaiting their final fulfillment. Christ has offered up the obedience of a new Adam. He has perfectly obeyed God's law and entered into the reward of life with God. One day he will bring his people fully and finally into a new and glorified Eden—a New Heavens and a New Earth.

In the era of the gospel, God's covenant is no longer with a nation. Rather, God's people are being drawn

from every nation to experience the blessings that Christ has won. Thus, its to this universal people—the *church*—that God echoes the words of the Mosaic Covenant, saying: "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, *a holy nation*, a people for his own possession that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light."

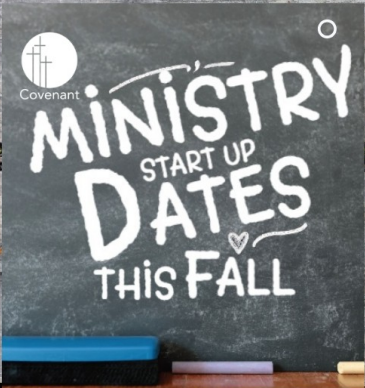

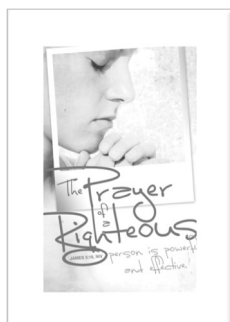

From the Heart of a Stephen Minister Christine Lind, Member



The Nooks and Crannies
of the Heart

During Christmas last year, as I walked across our church parking lot, the welcoming belltower situated strategically atop the building began to peel: “Joy to The World.” It stopped me in my tracks. The bells rang joy to my heart, as it awoke some unknown nook and cranny there waiting to be filled.

I began to wonder about this nook and cranny feeling and searched the definition of the saying; it reported: “Nooks and crannies of the heart, refers to the hidden or private aspects of a person’s emotions, character, or inner self. It suggests that there are parts of someone’s soul that are not readily seen or understood. The term implies a deep and perhaps unexplored part of a person’s being.”

I couldn’t have described it better what happened to me in the church parking lot.

I began to think about other times in my life (besides the beautiful bell awakening) when these special areas of my heart have been filled. A few flooded my mind: my husband reaching for my hand as we walked through a store; the experience of rocking my newborn in my arms; finding a personal handwritten letter in my mailbox adorned with a beautiful stamp,

There are also criteria, when awakening these parts of the hidden heart. A love and desire for it have to be there first. If I didn’t love my husband, or my baby, or the letter writer there would be nothing there to fill that longing. I couldn’t enjoy the ritual of an afternoon tea if I didn’t love tea (another nook and cranny). It’s personal.

But who created my personalized inner self? Who made my customized longings? David sings to the choirmaster: “O Lord, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You discern my thoughts from afar. You have searched out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O Lord, you know it all together” (Psalm 139:1-4 ESV).

Gratitude to someone has to go somewhere for this kind of joy; even non-believers believe in gratitude. But if you leave God out of the equation of gratitude for such a gift, you will never experience the depth of joy of “being known” by God recorded by the psalmist.

I know we love the big things, and those are important, too. But God is also in the little nooks and crannies of the heart, where he longs to reside.

If You Could Only Imagine

Most emergency medicine doctors go into this field because we don't desire to care for patients more than a few times in our career. Our motto is "treat them and street them." Calloused, I know, but that's how we're put together. We greatly respect and admire physicians who care for people for years.

Occasionally, we see a patient repeatedly in the ER and it's someone we don't mind doing so. Matt (not his real name) is one. Matt is just shy of three years old, has hydrocephalus, has never walked or talked and never will. He is fed via a tube inserted into his stomach. Matt has frequent seizures. When his mother can't get them to stop, she calls 911 and Matt comes to us. We give him additional anti-seizure medicine and then observe him until he is stable. Upon awakening, he smiles, winks at us, gives us a fist bump and is absolutely adorable.

Recently I saw Matt for the usual complaint. I gave him meds to stop the seizure. The seizing stopped, but this time he wasn't waking up. He remained unconscious. I ordered a scan of his brain.

The radiologist called me. "He has multiple areas of bleeding in his brain," he started. "They are significantly pushing on his brainstem. You better get this child out of here fast if you want him to survive."

Matt was in trouble. Matt was dying. I quickly called a neurosurgeon in Omaha and had the helicopter enroute.

I advised Matt's mother of the situation. She immediately left the room to make some phone calls. As the helicopter crew left the ER with Matt, I noticed how well his mom was holding up and advised her I would not have been able to do the same.

She smiled. "Matt is surrounded and protected by

God's army of angels. They will never let anything bad happen to him. He'll be OK."

"I don't know," I thought to myself. His scan looked awful. I had serious doubts about Matt surviving this injury.

But I contemplated her statement. *A vast, celestial military force was surrounding Matt.* Psalm 68:17 – "The chariots of God are tens of thousands and thousands and thousands." I went out to the hospital parking lot and looked into the sky, trying to envision what tens of thousands of God's chariots would look like. God's immense power and heavenly army would surely protect my buddy Matt. God is a powerful, victorious, and sovereign protector.

I couldn't get Matt off my mind. I prayed, worried, and wondered. Five days later I called his mom. "He just got home," she said. "He's not back to his old self yet, but he's doing better and will be fine."

His mother's belief in the celestial army proved to be correct.

God is all knowing and truly doesn't need armies of angels, but I believe He uses them to demonstrate His great power.

I hate it when Matt seizes and has to come to the hospital, but I so badly want to see him again so I can ask him what the army of angels looked like. What did they say? Did they have wings? Did they sing? Were they shouting out praises and glory to our most awesome God as they chaperoned you to Omaha? Did they surround you in a way that allowed you to know He was in control and your life was in His hands? I envision Matt giving me the biggest smile ever, and in doing so, he's saying, "If you could only imagine."

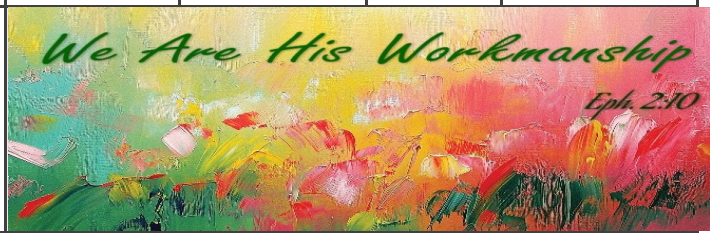
Please consider joining us. Again, this year *silence* is optional.
