God's Covenant with Abraham: Part 2

When the sun had gone down and it was dark, behold, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, “To your offspring I give this land.”

—Genesis 15:17–18

We have been exploring the history of God's redemptive covenants. Last month, we came to Abraham and examined Genesis 12. We saw God's promise to bless Abraham, and we observed the worldwide significance of God's promise. God's blessing was intended, in every way, to overturn the entrance of sin and curse into the world. The promises to Abraham were not, then, just for his physical descendants. Rather, the promises have been fulfilled in Christ. And Abraham's blessing has come to all nations—to any who join themselves in faith to Israel's Messiah. The promised land was a picture, under the Old Covenant, of the great restoration and consummation that God would one day bring in a New Heavens and New Earth.

But before we move on from this, we need to be very clear—on what basis were these promises were given to Abraham? Some imagine that in the Old Testament, God's people *worked* in order to earn God's favor—in order to be accepted by him and to experience his blessing. They then contrast this with the New Testament and the Christians experience of justification by faith.

But we need to observe that, even in the Old Testament, God's acceptance was upon Abraham simply because of God's mercy and grace. In Genesis, God's determination to bless came first. Then, God declares his gracious promises to Abraham. And, then, we find the wonderful verse: “And Abraham believed the LORD, and God counted it to him as righteousness.” Abraham's response of faith is the way that God declares him righteous—justified. That status is

enjoyed because of Abraham's faith not because of any righteous work that Abraham does.

To strengthen this point, the moment of Abraham's justification is followed by a remarkable ceremony. God has Abraham gather a heifer, a female goat, a ram, a turtledove, a young pigeon. And Abraham cuts them in half and he places the halves opposite one another. Now, in the Ancient world, this was a well-established way to make a covenant. The expectation was that the two parties would walk through the middle of cut-up animals. And, the effect was to say, “Cross my heart, hope to die, stick a thousand needles in my eye!” Or, more accurately, “If I turn away from this Covenant, may I be torn in two like these animals.” Yikes!

But what happens with the ceremony in Genesis 15? God puts Abraham into a deep sleep. And, God alone walks through the pieces. In Gen 15:17, it says: “When the sun had gone down and it was dark, behold, a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces.” What is that supposed to mean? It is a vision of God himself walking through the pieces. While Abraham sleeps, God walks through the severed animals and swears that he alone will be responsible to bring his Covenant promises about. He says, in effect, he'll see to it—even if it kills him. What a remarkable God we serve—a God ready to *give himself* to rescue from sin and death and to bring blessing and life.

Next month we will turn to the Mosaic Covenant. We will see that God's people are put to the test. Will they be obedient and remain in God's land, or will they reject God and be cast out? But, as we turn to the Mosaic Covenant, we will want to remember the foundation upon which the Mosaic Covenant is built—this amazing promise from God. God will bring his salvation, not by human work and effort, but because of his unshakeable purpose and plan.

At the Feet of Jesus

My wife and I are currently on a boat, traveling 13 days across the Atlantic Ocean from Florida to Portugal. Nine days to go. On days two and three, I stayed in my cabin, too seasick to eat or drink. There are only 49 passengers on this cruise, and many are suffering the same symptoms, all from the rough ocean water. I told my wife, who is doing fine, “those other people who are sick are in the same boat as I.” She didn’t like my humor.

Not much you can do on a boat when you are sick. The only options are to read and sleep. I am doing a lot of both.

I was intrigued by Luke 10. In verses 38-41, we learn of Jesus visiting the home of Martha so he could teach and preach to his disciples. Martha’s sister Mary was also present. Mary was at the feet of Jesus, listening to what he had to say. Verses 40-41 say, *But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, “Lord, don’t you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!”* “Martha, Martha,” the Lord answered, *“you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed – or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better and it will not be taken away from her.”* These verses hit me hard as I am like Martha.

These verses highlight the dangers of busyness overshadowing spiritual priorities. Obviously, Jesus isn’t against service, but sitting at his feet to worship and listen takes precedence over activity. Every day I must complete my research work, my exercising, my visiting family, my emergency room director requirements, my emails, and so many additional tasks that often can wait. These things cause anxiety from

the time I awaken. But focusing on the one thing Jesus mentions brings true peace. Daily devotion to Him is so much better.

I lost Wi-Fi somewhere north of Brazil and couldn’t get my research work completed, along with countless additional relatively meaningless tasks. If I was going to be sick, I thought, at least I could get tons of work done. Instead, I read the Bible and was led to this chapter. I read, reflected, and prayed over those verses.

I feel somewhat better today and for the first time in three days, ate a small meal. Am I improving because of all the medicine combinations I’ve tried, because my aged body is finally getting used to the motion of the boat, or is it because my stress level has markedly lessened, knowing I, like Martha, was upset about things that didn’t truly matter, and instead, sat at the feet of Jesus and learned from His word in the Bible? It’s probably a combination of all the above, but I know the book of Luke was a major reason.

I’m attempting to form a “JOMO” mindset. “Joy of Missing Out.” I can remain joyful if I can’t surf the net, can’t get research work done, and don’t feel well enough to participate in boat activities. I can focus instead on spiritual growth rather than worldly demands.

I have nine days and roughly 3200 miles to go. Rough seas? Bad weather? I don’t care. I can always stay in my cabin and sit at the feet of Jesus, learning what’s truly important.

I strongly encourage you to form a JOMO mindset.

Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. James 4:8 –

Do you pray for *all to be well* with your life? Your family, spouse, job, finances?

I'm not saying I don't pray about these concerns. I've just learned over the years that not all's going to be well, all at the same time, no matter how hard I try. My sister, Carol, sometimes ends our phone conversations with the *all is well* phrase, but she means something different. It's not a wish or positive thinking. She is blessing me with, "All is well in Christ." He is our anchor. We're safe. Let's go to bed.

What I'm discussing here is the thinking that I wanted all to be well, all the time, with everything, everywhere in my life. I didn't realize it, but I was striving for the impossible. That's trying to have a perfect life. The challenge to align all my little stars in my little nucleus and try to get them to stay put has been a futile endeavor. One star usually and always goes rogue on me.

In my defense, and yours (if you're relating), is that we were made in God's image and we were made to reside in Paradise, in perfection, where all was well, all the time. But then came the Fall. And the stars got out of their perfect alignment, not in the universe but in our souls. Even though Adam and Eve were the ones expelled from the Garden of Eden, we became exiled from our homeland. So, the Great Pull begins. We were created with a mindset to live in a Perfect World, but live our lives as refugees in a Fallen World.

It was around 1974 when I surrendered my life to Jesus Christ and began a relationship that will not let me go. Before that I was merely in a religion and not even committed to that. I couldn't keep up with the laws or the rules of the religion, so to get rid of my guilt, I got rid of the rules and threw God out with the bath

water. Guilt was gone, at least for a while. Until guilt from sin in my life drove me back to God, but this time I didn't put my trust in the rules, I put my trust in Jesus Christ. Grace and forgiveness and knowing that I had the assurance of salvation gave me unspeakable joy. Oh, happy day, when Jesus washed my sins away.

But it took me sometime to become aware of this impossible desire of constantly trying to align my stars in a perfect order. To get the sad stars to stay out of the way of my happy stars: for my marriage to be without arguments, for my children to be healthy, for my relationships to be wonderful, and for our finances to reach their perfect goals – all at the same time. None of this, in and of itself, is wrong, it's just that I had no idea that not only did I have a sin nature to combat, I had a false entitlement to a perfect world to combat. You can't have everything perfect if you don't live in Eden anymore. But I must remind myself every day.

In the classic movie *Now, Voyager*, Bette Davis in the closing shot, stares up at the sky and calmly tells her lover, *Don't let's ask for the moon, we have the stars*. But I do shoot for the moon in all I do, and to strive for excellence, to keep my eye on the goal, so at least I'll land somewhere in those pesky stars. Where on any given day, one will get out of line; then my sister will call and tell me all is well. All is well in Christ. All is perfect in Christ Jesus – all the time.

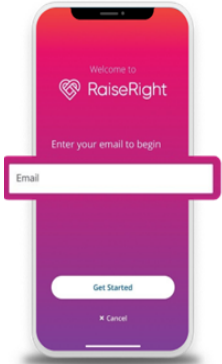

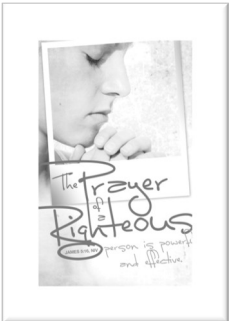

Summer Sunday School: The Apostle's Creed

Each Sunday this summer, **starting June 7** from 10:05 to 10:50 a.m. in the dining room, you are invited to attend a **class on The Apostles' Creed, which focuses on the Trinity.**

Why study The Apostles' Creed?

Some may say that their relationship with Jesus is really all that matters. They explain that knowing that Jesus is always there, and that I can always pray to Him should be enough. All the details about who Jesus is, or who his Father or the Holy Spirit is, or what Jesus actually did and how He did it, they may say, are not vitally important.

Or is it?

In a 1950 essay that still has relevance today, *How Important Is Creed?* A.W. Tozer responded to this approach to *no-creed* advocates. He wrote, *What is overlooked here is that the conflict of Christ with the Pharisees was over the question of who He was. His claim to be God stirred the Pharisees to fury. He could have cooled the fire of their anger by backing away from His claim to equality with God, but He refused to do it. And he further taught that faith in Him embraced a belief that He is very God, and that apart from this there could be no salvation for anyone.*

Benefits of the Sunday School class:

Confirming detailed knowledge in great detail about the identity of the One in whom you have placed your faith is only one benefit of attending the summer Sunday School class, which is a video series published by Third Millennium Seminary: *The Apostles' Creed: The Trinity*. Each video will lead the class to consider:

- just how immense and authoritative our God is, and the awesomeness of His power and love
- the difference between the essential doctrines of historical Christianity, and the areas in which Christians can agree to disagree
- how solidifying our Christian convictions can prepare us for the ever-shifting values and standards in today's culture
- exactly how we as believers should live our lives in ways that exalt and honor Jesus as God the Son, born of a virgin, crucified as the perfect sacrifice for humankind's sin, but also resurrected and now ruling and reigning as King of Kings
- the ongoing, life-giving, and truth-revealing ministry of the Holy Spirit who lives within God's people
...and much more!

Attend and learn!

We will limit our focus of Christian beliefs to those affirming the Trinity. Each lesson is independently focused, so please don't choose not to attend just because you missed or will miss a lesson. Come and get to know our God better!
