Fundraising

Fundraising helps lower the cost of going on the Mission Trip. The IRS has regulations that if a parish group is fundraising by doing some activity, those from the group who participate in the fundraising cannot be "rewarded" by allocating more of the fundraising proceeds to defray the cost of their participation in group activities. All fundraising activities are done as a group and must be used to defray the cost, not of individuals, but of the entire group. We work together so that everyone will have the opportunity to experience Mission Trek regardless of their financial circumstance.

Estimated Costs

Final costs are not known until the end of April after the bulk of our fundraising. Each trip cost is different and varies greatly on airfare, car vehicles etc. Historically families have paid anywhere from \$50 to \$400 depending on a variety of variables and the success of fundraising.

Mission Trek 2025-2026

Mission Trek is a hands on program for 6th-12th graders who want to actively grow and live out their faith. The Mission Trek program is a year long commitment (Sept 25-Aug 26) of Service, Faith Sharing, Community Building and Fundraising that culminates in a week long Catholic Service Learning Experience in the summer.

6th-12th Grade



The Agape Service Project serves migrant farmworkers in Whatcom County. Through service-learning immersion experiences, participants learn about human dignity, issues affecting migrant farmworkers and why we as Catholics are called to serve. Through our food bank, community support and time spent with the migrant families, we have the ultimate goal of building personal relationships with our brothers and sisters in Christ.



10th-12th Grade



Esperanza International works to provide international service experiences for our volunteer groups in Tijuana, Mexico. They host groups of volunteers to help build homes and work on other projects in the under-served communities of Tijuana. High School students spend a week in an immersion experience of Mexican cultures, socioeconomic development and leadership building.
