
ST. SEBASTIAN CHRISTMAS WISH LIST 2025.

We are planning for an outdoor Stations of the Cross walkway around the pond on the north side of our campus. Please find below an artistic rendition of this project. Stations will be 28 X 20 (inches) carved white stone plaques depicting 14 stations. At the thirteenth station we are planning to place a 5 X 4 (feet) image of the Pieta. At the main entrance to the walkway we also will have a life size image of Arch Angel Michael.

The stations can be sponsored at the rate of \$ 3000. You can also sponsor a station by donating a portion of the price tag beginning at \$ 500. The image of Pieta and Arch Angel Michael are at the rate of \$ 6000. These statues can also be sponsored by donating a portion of the price beginning at \$ 1000.

We plan to complete this project in the year 2026 and have it ready for Lent 2027. Upon completion names of the donors will be placed on respective stations and statues. Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

The annual collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious, which helps meet the growing needs of more than 21,000 elderly sisters, brothers and religious-order priests who have been faithful servants of the Church, will be next weekend, December 13/14.

Rising health care costs and the absence of traditional retirement plans have placed significant strain on many religious communities. In 2024, the average annual cost of care for those over age 70 was about \$56,600 per person, with skilled nursing care averaging \$96,000. Also, the average annual Social Security benefit for a religious is \$9,090, while the average lay beneficiary receives \$23,704. The Retirement Fund for Religious helps address these challenges.

Since 1988, the U.S. Catholic bishops have organized a collection to address the deficit in retirement funds among religious communities. Last year, the appeal raised more than \$28.1 million, providing assistance to 266 U.S. religious communities. Beyond financial aid, the collection supports educational programs, empowering religious communities to plan for their long-term needs.

I am grateful for the impact these women and men have had on our faith journeys, inspiring and guiding us all. Your donation to the Retirement Fund for Religious plays a vital role in providing necessary financial support. I invite you to give whatever you can toward this year's collection, and please keep all our women and men religious in your prayers.
