

## Palm Sunday-March 24

• Community Parade –You are invited to remember Jesus's entry to Jerusalem with a community parade beginning at Hopkins Green – gather at 9:15 and process to a number of downtown Lexington churches, ending up at Lexington Presbyterian.



• Hot Cross Buns –One of the Christian traditions we are familiar with that comes from Great Britain is eating "cross buns" during the Easter season. These fruited and spiced yeast buns are traditionally eaten hot or toasted on Good Friday. They are marked with a cross as a symbol of the crucifixion. The bread and the dried fruit which has been soaked in wine are reminders of the Last Supper and our communion with Christ. The spices in the buns may represent the anointing of Christ as he was wrapped in a linen shroud for the tomb. There are many superstitions associated with these buns—if hung in the kitchen or nailed to the hearth they are said to protect against fires and ensure that all breads rise well. A piece of a hot cross bun given to someone who is ill is said to help them recover good health. Sharing a hot cross bun with another is

supposed to ensure friendship throughout the coming year.

We will be taking part in this tradition by serving hot cross buns after the community Palm Sunday parade. Please join us in Brady Chapel during the Sunday School hour on Palm Sunday to "break bread" and share the blessings – and if you want to help prepare them the day before, the baking shift is from 9:00 a.m.-noon on the 23rd.

#### • Stations of the Cross

When you arrive at LexingtonPres, you are invited to take a self-guided walk through intergenerational 'stations of the cross' – complete with related coloring posters for our youngest church family members. Follow signs to the Dunlap and Faith Village halls to find the station.

Our Maundy Thursday service will take place at 7:00 p.m. on **March 28**, location TBA. We will gather for a Good Friday service at noon in the sanctuary on **March 29**. Then, on Easter Sunday (**March 31**), we join our neighbors for a Community sunrise service at 7:00 a.m. at Trinity United Methodist Church, where Drew will bring the sermon. At LexPres we will observe one Easter service at 11:00 a.m. (no Sunday school or Kids' Club that day).

## **Cheesy Tater Tot Casserole**

I served this cheesy tater tot casserole at our Shrove Tuesday dinner and I had several requests for the recipe. I hope you enjoy it!

#### Ingredients:

- 1 Pound Jimmy Dean Sausage (regular)
- 3 Large Eggs
- 2 Cups Whole Milk
- 1 Bag Tater Tots

**Bacon Bits Sharp** 

Cheddar Cheese or a cheese blend you like

1 Teaspoon Onion Powder

Pepper Flakes (optional)

Salt & Pepper

#### **Directions:**

Cook and drain sausage. Spray baking dish with cooking spray (PAM). Spread the sausage on the bottom of the pan and sprinkle some of the cheese on top. Top this layer with tater tots and sprinkle with some more cheese and bacon bits. In a bowl, beat together the eggs, milk, onion powder, pepper flakes, salt and pepper. Pour mixture over the tater tots. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 45-60 minutes until golden brown and firmly set. For a more spicy casserole, use Jimmy Dean HOT sausage and increase the pepper flakes. Adjust the amounts of onion powder, pepper flakes, bacon bits, salt and pepper to your taste. Read the tater tot bag and you will find that they are gluten free, making this dish suitable for gluten free people.

# Rafiki Report

Rafiki was founded over 30 years ago for the purpose of helping Africans know God and grow in their faith. In Swahili, Rafiki means friend. Currently Rafiki Training Villages operate in ten countries: Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Liberia, Malawi, Nigeria, Rwanda, Tanzania, Uganda, and Zambia.

Our Rafiki Home Office travels to Africa this month, and we pray for their safety and health. Over 55,000 Bibles are currently en route to Nigeria and 23 schools in Tanzania are implementing the Rafiki Bible Study. With thanksgiving and praise, there are over 160 Rafiki Institute for Classical Education (RICE) students and over 3600 students in our 10 Rafiki schools.

Missionaries from the Lexington/Rockbridge County greater areas not only serve as Rafiki representatives in our local churches, but also minister as missionaries in Rafiki Villages throughout Africa. On March 8 Jane Hoadley will be journeying to Malawi to serve for six months. Please pray for her safety, health, and protection as she prepares to spread the Word of God. We pray for God's clear direction and provision for her and all those in the Villages.

Please join me in praying for the teachers in Malawi to continually grow in understanding and conviction of Scripture's teachings and for God's provision for Rafiki Institute for Classical Education (RICE) students to grow in their love for God and to embrace God's calling. Prayers requested for the Holy Spirit to illuminate hearts through Bible Study transforming the lives of the people leading to a deeper relationship with the Lord.
