Invitation to Lenten Observance

On the church calendar, the forty-day journey to the cross and grave of Christ begins **Wednesday, March 5**. The term Lent comes from the same root word as *lengthen*, and came to be associated with this season because of the noticeable lengthening of days that occurs in the early spring in the northern hemisphere. Underground and deep within trees and bushes, new leaves and new life begin to awaken. We invite you to accept a Lenten invitation to travel inward, exploring God's call to repentance and renewal in your own life.

"And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). In Ethiopia the new school year began with major challenges- widespread economic and security crises, and more than nine million school children out of school. Thanks be to

God that the Rafiki Schools opened at the end of September despite those challenges. Rafiki also received the wonderful news that all seven of their recent graduates would have the opportunity to attend university. Metsy was one of the seven graduating students who passed her National Exams. What a testament to God's faithfulness in the lives of these young men and women.

Lexington Presbyterian Church has faithfully supported orphan Metsenanat "Metsy" Tages who was born on June 2, 2004, and arrived at Ethiopia Rafiki Village on May 1, 2010. Shortly after Metsy entered the Rafiki Ethiopia Village, Lexington Presbyterian Church through the faith, guidance, and love of Mary Raine Paxton, embraced and "adopted" Metsy. Many of our members recall watching videos and seeing pictures of Metsy as she grew in faith living in the Rafiki Village. Through the years a strong bond has been formed with Metsy which has continued to grow and strengthen with LexPres members. She is eternally grateful for our spiritual and monetary support. Metsy entered Rafiki Ethiopia Village not speaking English, unable to read or write. With praise and thanksgiving, Metsy recently graduated from grade level 12 and passed her National University entrance exams with great results. Less than six percent of grade twelve graduates in Ethiopia passed the national exam and Mesty was one such student.

She is now enrolled at Hawassa University pursuing a degree in Public Administration and is on track to earn her Bachelor of Arts in this field. Although she has experienced some struggles adjusting to food, climate, and dorm life, she continues to show faith, determination and a positive attitude in her studies. She is active in church and fellowship programs. Overall, Metsy is doing well and looks forward to communicating with LexPres members. Please pray for Metsy and all the students to remain strong in their faith, and to be a light to others; pray also for their good health and safety as there is instability in Ethiopia.

As Metsy begins this next chapter of her life, please continue to pray for and support her.
