Adult Discipleship Opportunities

Sunday 9:45-10:45 a.m. Classes begin September 14

Ask Seek Knock – This fall, the ASK class will read Ross Douthat's *Believe*. A contributing editor for the New York Times on spiritual and religious matters, Douthat addresses in this book the pressing question of why people believe in God and in concepts of faith and argues that to believe is more reasonable and rational than to not do so. A runaway bestseller since its publication in February, the book will anchor discussion in the class, which has both in person and Zoom options. The in-person group meets in room 113; email facilitator Ann Massie (massiea@wlu.edu) for the Zoom link.

Koinonia - This class is a group of ordinary people of faith seeking to strengthen our spiritual growth through fellowship and conversation. We pursue God's grace, what it means, and how it impacts our daily lives through books, articles, shared life stories, and other resources. We hope to encourage each other on our spiritual journey towards God. This year, the group will continue reading and discussing Frederick Buechner's *Secrets in the Dark*, a collection of sermons from a pastor whose advice to all who seek God is "listen to your life!" The group welcomes newcomers even if they are unfamiliar with Buechner's book. Koinonia meets in room 111.

Men's Sunday School Class - The Men's Sunday School Class was formed to promote discipleship, learning, and fellowship. Ours is a discussion class with members of the class rotating responsibility for facilitating discussion. We are open to all men regardless of age or background. This fall the Men's class will be reading and discussing the book of Acts. The class meets in room D-5.

Scripture and Doughnuts - Grab a doughnut, open the Bible, and talk. It's that simple. Join this class of confessed non-Bible experts wrestling with how God's words encourage us to live our everyday life. S&D usually focuses on the week's sermon scripture, and meets in Dunlap Auditorium.

ParentsTalk – This new discussion class for parents and guardians with kids at home (or those planning to be parents) examines major issues in the life of contemporary children and their families through the lens of selected scriptures. Topics include rest, rivalries, discipline, calming, worry, and change. Come explore how we experience these in our families and how our focus scriptures may comfort or challenge us as caregivers. Lectio Divina - The friendly folks at Lectio Divina are eager to accept new participants either online (Zoom) or in person (Room 113) every Tuesday morning from 10-11 a.m. We contemplate and discuss the week's Bible selection. It's a cherished time to slow down, listen, and share as desired. No experience or Bible knowledge required. Zoom link appears in the weekly email newsletter.

Leah Ruth Circle - The Leah Ruth Circle is a spiritually-uplifting fellowship of Christian women. The women support each other through fellowship, Bible study/devotion, prayer, and service to the church and community. They affirm women's calls to leadership and spiritual growth, raise concerns, and channel information throughout the church. This group meets on the second Wednesday of the month at 1:00 in Brady Chapel. All women are welcome.

Men's Bible Study - All men are welcome to attend this morning study on the second and fourth Thursdays of the month. We will begin at 8 a.m. with a hard stop at 9 a.m. We will meet in Brady Chapel. This study will be facilitated by Drew and is designed to be a meaningful gathering for both infrequent and consistent attendees. It begins this fall with a study of Jesus's parables.

To my surprise, it was wonderful. I made it for the picnic and I had several requests for the recipe. So here it is:

Neiman Marcus Cake Recipe From Allrecipe

Ingredients:

1 (15.25 ounce) package yellow cake mix

4 Eggs, divided

½ Cup butter, melted

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

3 ½ Cups confectioners' sugar

8 ounces cream cheese, softened


Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees and grease a 13/9 inch baking pan.

Combine yellow cake mix, 2 eggs, butter, and vanilla in a large bowl and mix well. The batter should be stiff. Spread batter into the prepared pan.

Combine confectioners' sugar, cream cheese, and the remaining 2 eggs in a separate bowl; mix well and pour over the top of the cake batter.

Bake in a preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 35 minutes. Cool and cut into small square pieces. Enjoy.

Rafiki Report

Rafiki Report - September 2025

"Truly, I say to you, as you did it not to one of the least of these, you did it not to me" (Matthew 25:45). For over 20 years, Rafiki's ten Orphan Care Programs have been dedicated to the promotion of the spiritual and emotional wellbeing of children and to cultivating a family environment in which each child could have the opportunity to follow God's plan and purpose for his or her life. Thus far, the Orphan Care Program has had the privilege of touching the lives of over 900 children in which 334 have finished high school and 302 have been granted a Rafiki Scholarship to pursue further education and training. One such young lady is Metsenanat "Metsy" Tages who entered the Rafiki Orphan Care Program in Ethiopia on May 1, 2010. Through the years, LexPres members have helped support her monetarily and encouraged her spiritual growth through letters and cards. The light of Christ shines through Metsy as she participates in Bible study programs and devotionals at Hawassa University as she pursues a degree in Public Administration. Metsy asks we include her in our prayers specifically praying for her to live an exemplary life for others. She prays she will be a faithful servant to God and to the responsibility He has given her in the University Christian Fellowship Program. She is active in both the worship program and choir.

Rafiki has established 10 villages in 10 African countries serving as the epicenter for all the different aspects of their work. Each Village is supervised by missionaries and equipped with schools, orphan housing, a teachers college (RICE), dining hall, missionary homes, libraries, a widows program and so much more. Rafiki is fully committed to the vision of distributing their resources to Africa (primarily through their partnership with 23 African church denominations), the USA, and the world.

Monetary donations to help support Metsy's educational and spiritual life can be made by check, payable to Lexington Presbyterian Church with "Metsy" written on the memo line. Our generosity is making a lasting impact on Metsy's life, and hopefully, we will continue to support her as she pursues her further education. Funds given to her account will go toward her scholarship. Thank you for cultivating godly contributors in Africa.
