Celebrating Indigenous Peoples Day: Beyond celebration: Reconciling our Relationship with Indigenous Peoples

On October 13, we observed **Indigenous Peoples Day**, a moment to reflect not just with words, but with action. While land acknowledgments are important, the Church is called to deeper reconciliation with Indigenous communities.

Last year, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops released "Keeping Christ's Sacred Promise: A Pastoral Framework for Indigenous Ministry." This document recognizes the trauma Indigenous peoples have faced—boarding schools, family separation, and displacement—and acknowledges the Church's role in that history.

The bishops urge listening, healing, and inclusion, calling for partnerships with ministries like Catholic Charities, and supporting Native traditions that are compatible with Catholic teaching. The framework highlights the importance of inculturated liturgy, sacramental life, and addressing social injustices still affecting Native communities today.

Let us continue to pray, learn, and work for healing—honoring the deep faith and cultural richness of Indigenous Catholics.




For the Safety of our Church and Community

The Volunteer Coordinator is responsible for recruiting, training and managing volunteers with the church, ensuring their effective participation in various ministries and events.



Saint Pedro Calungsod



San Pedro Calungsod was a Filipino teen who gave his life for Christ. At just 13, he joined Spanish missionaries traveling to the Marianas Islands to share the Catholic faith. A devoted young man, Pedro loved the Church, received the Sacraments often, and was eager to teach others about Jesus.

Through his efforts, many were baptized. But not everyone welcomed the missionaries. Some village leaders, fearing the loss of their influence, opposed them. In 1672, at age 17, Pedro was killed alongside a priest while baptizing a child at the request of the village chief's wife.

Pedro was beatified in 2000 by Pope St. John Paul II and canonized on October 21, 2012, by Pope Benedict XVI.

That same day, the Shrine of Filipino Saints (San Lorenzo Ruiz & San Pedro Calungsod) was blessed by Bishop Eusebio Elizondo at Immaculate Conception Church in Seattle.

As we enter the month of November, a time dedicated to remembering the faithful departed, we invite you to take part in a meaningful tradition to honor and remember our deceased loved ones.


We will be setting up an Ofrenda Table in the church, a sacred space where you are welcome to place a framed photo of a loved one who has passed away.
