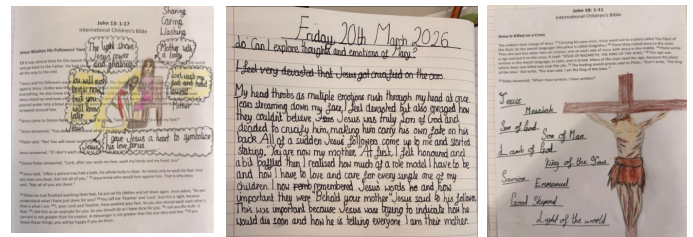
Catholic Life of the School - Choir

Castle Park visit

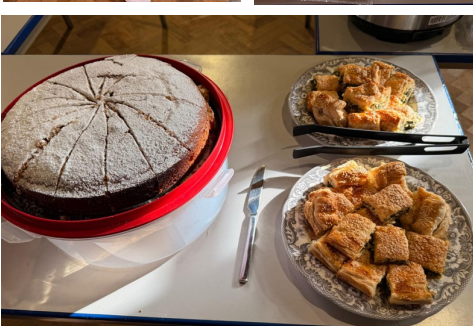
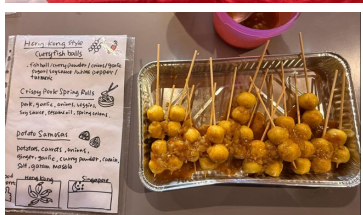
