PROFESSIONAL CAREER

Averaged 14.4 points, 3.7 rebounds, and 3.2 assists in 28.3 minutes per game during the 2025–26 season with the Nilan Bisons in Finland, shooting 44.1% from the field, 35.1% from three-point range, and 79.4% from the free-throw line... Established himself as a consistent starter and versatile backcourt contributor in his first professional season... Delivered multiple strong scoring performances, including several 20+ point outings and a season-high 23 points, while also providing steady playmaking and defensive activity... Recorded well-rounded games such as 9 points, 9 rebounds, and 7 assists, highlighting his all-around impact... Contributed across multiple statistical categories throughout the season, combining scoring, secondary playmaking, and perimeter defense while adjusting smoothly to the professional level.

2025–26 (Finland – Nilan Bisons): Appeared in the 2025–26 season with the Nilan Bisons, establishing himself as a versatile backcourt contributor and consistent starter, averaging 14.4 points, 3.7 rebounds, and 3.2 assists in 28.3 minutes per game, while shooting 44.1% from the field, 35.1% from three-point range, and 79.4% from the free-throw line... Delivered multiple high-level scoring performances throughout the season, including a 23-point outing vs. Lahti (Feb. 18), a 22-point performance on 9-of-13 shooting vs. Kouvot (Feb. 11), and several 20-point games early in the season against Korihait (Oct. 24), Joensuun Kataja (Nov. 1), and KTP Basket (Oct. 17)... Added strong all-around contributions, including a 9-point, 9-rebound, 7-assist performance vs. Kouvot (Dec. 28) and multiple games with 5+ assists and multi-steal efforts, highlighting his playmaking and defensive activity... Showcased consistent perimeter shooting with multiple multi-three-point games, including 5-of-8 from deep vs. Pyrinto (Jan. 15) and 4-of-5 vs. Korihait (Dec. 30)... Contributed across multiple statistical categories throughout the season, regularly producing double-digit scoring while providing secondary playmaking, defensive pressure, and positional versatility across both guard spots.

UNIVERSITY CAREER

Averaged approximately 11.2 points, 2.9 rebounds, 3.0 assists, and 1.1 steals in roughly 29.7 minutes per game across his NCAA career at Loyola Marymount, Ball State, and Incarnate Word, along with his first professional season in Finland (Nilan Bisons), shooting around 41–44% from the field, 34–36% from three-point range, and 72–79% from the free-throw line... Established himself as a dynamic guard who progressed from a rotational contributor into a primary ball-handler and offensive leader, taking on increased responsibilities each season... Produced multiple high-level scoring performances throughout his career, including several 25–29 point games at the NCAA level and consistent 20+ point outings professionally... Demonstrated strong playmaking ability with numerous high-assist games, including a 13-assist performance and multiple 8–10 assist outings, highlighting his vision and ability to control the pace of play... Delivered well-rounded stat lines across different levels, contributing in scoring, rebounding, and defensive categories with consistent multi-steal performances... Posted strong single-season outputs such as 15.8 points, 4.6 rebounds, and 4.5 assists (2023–24, Ball State), 15.0 points and 5.0 assists (2024–25, Incarnate Word), and 14.4 points, 3.7 rebounds, and 3.2 assists (2025–26, Finland), demonstrating sustained production in high-usage roles... Showcased versatility across both guard positions, with the ability to score at all three levels, facilitate offense, and defend on the perimeter... Established himself as a reliable and adaptable backcourt contributor capable of impacting the game across multiple statistical categories at both the collegiate and professional levels.

2024–25 (NCAA – Incarnate Word): Appeared in the 2024–25 season with Incarnate Word, establishing himself as a primary ball-handler and offensive leader, starting every game at the point guard position... Averaged 15.0 points, 3.3 rebounds, and 5.0 assists in 33.1 minutes per game while shooting 41.1% from the field, 36.9% from three-point range, and 72.2% from the free-throw line... Delivered multiple high-level scoring performances, including 29-point outings vs. Houston Christian (Feb. 1) and Southeastern Louisiana (Feb. 8), along with a 27-point game vs. Southeastern Louisiana (Jan. 25)... Added a 25-point performance vs. South Alabama (Nov. 25) and several 20+ point games throughout the season, showcasing consistent scoring ability... Demonstrated strong playmaking with multiple high-assist games, including 13 assists vs. Our Lady of the Lake (Dec. 15) and several 8–10 assist performances... Recorded well-rounded stat lines such as 22 points, 5 rebounds, and 5 steals vs. Jacksonville (Mar. 24) and 14 points with 9 assists vs. Lamar (Feb. 24), highlighting his all-around impact... Contributed across multiple statistical categories throughout the season, combining scoring, playmaking, and defensive activity while handling a high-usage role as the team's lead guard.

2023–24 (NCAA – Ball State): Appeared in the 2023–24 season with Ball State, establishing himself as a high-usage guard and consistent starter, averaging 15.8 points, 4.6 rebounds, and 4.5 assists in 36.3 minutes per game, while shooting 44.1% from the field, 35.7% from three-point range, and 76.0% from the free-throw line... Delivered multiple standout performances, including a 29-point outing vs. Old Dominion (Nov. 11) and a 26-point performance vs. Minnesota (Dec. 21), showcasing his scoring ability against strong competition... Added several 20+ point games, including 25 points vs. Toledo (Jan. 13), 25 points vs. Western Michigan (Mar. 2), and 23 points vs. Kent State (Mar. 5), demonstrating consistent offensive production... Recorded strong all-around performances,

including 22 points and 9 rebounds vs. Ohio (Feb. 6) and 19 points, 8 rebounds, and 7 assists vs. Northern Illinois (Feb. 20), highlighting his versatility and impact across multiple statistical categories... Contributed as a primary playmaker with multiple 6+ assist games, while also providing defensive activity with several multi-steal performances... Played heavy minutes throughout the season, consistently leading the offense and establishing himself as a reliable scoring and playmaking presence.

2022–23 (NCAA – Loyola Marymount): Appeared in the 2022–23 season with Loyola Marymount, contributing as a rotational guard with both starting and bench responsibilities, averaging 9.8 points, 1.7 rebounds, and 2.2 assists in 25.5 minutes per game, while shooting 40.1% from the field, 35.3% from three-point range, and 62.2% from the free-throw line... Showcased scoring potential with multiple double-digit performances, including a 20-point outing vs. Colorado State (Nov. 30) and another 20-point performance vs. Pacific (Dec. 31)... Added a 19-point game vs. BYU (Feb. 2) and 15 points vs. Gonzaga (Jan. 19), demonstrating the ability to produce offensively against high-level competition... Delivered efficient shooting nights, including 15 points on 6-of-7 shooting vs. Portland (Dec. 29) and 14 points on 4-of-5 shooting vs. San Diego (Jan. 14)... Contributed across multiple areas with solid playmaking and defensive activity, recording several multi-assist games and adding steals in key moments... Demonstrated versatility across the guard positions, providing scoring bursts, perimeter shooting, and energy in both starting and reserve roles throughout the season.

2021–22 (NCAA – Loyola Marymount): Appeared in the 2021–22 season with Loyola Marymount, contributing primarily in a rotational role off the bench while earning occasional starts, averaging 8.4 points, 1.3 rebounds, and 1.7 assists in 22.3 minutes per game, while shooting 45.9% from the field, 33.3% from three-point range, and 75.0% from the free-throw line... Showcased scoring ability with multiple double-digit performances, including a season-high 19 points on 8-of-12 shooting vs. San Diego (Jan. 29)... Added efficient outings such as 14 points on 6-of-10 shooting vs. Pacific (Feb. 26) and 13 points on 5-of-7 shooting vs. Pacific (Feb. 19)... Contributed solid perimeter shooting with multiple multi-three-point games, including 3-of-5 from beyond the arc vs. Pacific (Feb. 19)... Provided steady production in limited minutes, recording several efficient scoring performances and contributing as a secondary playmaker... Demonstrated versatility across guard positions, bringing energy, shooting, and depth to the rotation throughout the season.

2020–21 (NCAA – Loyola Marymount): Appeared in the 2020–21 season with Loyola Marymount, earning a consistent starting role and contributing as a primary guard, averaging 7.1 points, 2.2 rebounds, and 3.4 assists in 31.1 minutes per game, while shooting 31.7% from the field, 27.0% from three-point range, and 77.8% from the free-throw line... Showcased playmaking ability with multiple high-assist performances, including 9 assists vs. Pacific (Feb. 13) and 9 assists vs. Santa Clara (Jan. 23), highlighting his role as a facilitator... Recorded a season-high 16 points vs. Pepperdine (Feb. 25), along with several double-digit scoring outings including 12 points vs. Southern Utah (Nov. 25) and 10-point performances against Minnesota (Nov. 28 & Nov. 30) and San Francisco (Mar. 5)... Contributed across multiple areas with solid rebounding and defensive activity, including a 5-rebound effort vs. Portland (Jan. 25) and multiple multi-steal games... Demonstrated versatility across both guard positions, handling significant minutes while contributing as a scorer, playmaker, and perimeter defender throughout the season.

PERSONAL

Jalin Anderson is a dynamic guard known for his scoring ability, playmaking, and competitive edge. A three-star recruit out of Dream City Christian (Arizona) under Coach Ray Weathers, he built a strong foundation that carried into a productive collegiate career. Born February 5, 2002, in Jackson, Tennessee, he is the son of Patricia and Brady Anderson and has one sister and one brother. Anderson has competed against high-level talent, including NBA standout LaMelo Ball, and brings a tough, athletic mindset—noting that if not for basketball, he would have pursued boxing or football. Off the court, he has an interest in psychology, reflecting his composed, high-IQ approach to the game.
