PROFESIONNAL CAREER

Contributed 13.8 points, 3.0 assists, 2.8 rebounds, and 1.1 steals in 33.7 minutes across 10 professional games with Proteas EKA AEL in the Cyprus Division A during the 2025–26 season, ranking third on the team in scoring while serving as a primary ball handler and consistent contributor on both ends of the floor.

2025-26: Played in 10 games for Proteas EKA AEL in the Cyprus Division A during the 2025–26 season, averaging 13.8 points (.355 FG%, .313 3P%, .773 FT%), 3.0 assists, 2.8 rebounds and 1.1 steals in 33.7 minutes per game ... Opened the season with seven points vs. AEK Larnaca (Oct. 11, 2025) ... Posted 15 points and six assists at Apollon Limassol (Oct. 3, 2025) ... Scored 22 points against Keravnos (Oct. 19, 2025), showcasing his perimeter scoring ability ... Recorded a season-high 27 points vs. Morphou (Nov. 9, 2025) ... Added 12 points against Frederick Achilleas Kaimakliou (Dec. 5, 2025) ... Finished with 19 points and three assists vs. Anorthosis Ammohostou (Dec. 12, 2025) ... Ranked third on the team in scoring while serving as a primary ball handler and key contributor on both ends of the floor.

UNIVERSITY CAREER

Averaged 8.5 points, 2.5 assists, 2.2 rebounds, and 0.8 steals in 25.9 minutes across 140 games played with the University of Colorado Buffaloes from 2020–21 through 2024–25 in the Pac-12 Conference... Appeared in every contest during two full seasons, earning multiple starting roles and serving as both a primary and secondary ball handler throughout his career... Recorded numerous double-figure scoring performances, led the team in scoring on multiple occasions, and developed into a reliable perimeter shoot.

2019-20 (Freshman): Sat out the 2019–20 season as a redshirt while fully engaging in team workouts and practices.

2020-21 (Freshman): Averaged 3.7 points and ranked second on the team with 42 assists as a freshman Buffalo, backing up three-time All-Pac-12 guard McKinley Wright IV ... Scored in double figures twice, posting 11 points in his collegiate debut vs. South Dakota (Nov. 25) and 10 points against Washington (Dec. 20) ... Appeared in 30 of 32 games with one start at No. 12/16 Tennessee (Dec. 8), finishing with seven points and two assists ... Recorded a

season-high six assists against Utah (Jan. 30), becoming the first Buffalo other than Wright to reach six assists in a game in two seasons ... Showed flashes off the bench, scoring eight points and hitting two 3-pointers in the Pac-12 Tournament semifinal win over USC (Mar. 12) ... Converted 11 of 12 free throws on the season.

2021-22 (Sophomore): Averaged 11.1 points and 2.4 assists per game, starting 28 of 33 games and appearing in every contest ... Finished second on the team in assists and third in scoring while leading Colorado in 3-point makes and attempts (43–124) as well as free throw percentage (.826) ... Scored 20 points vs. New Mexico (Nov. 13) and followed with a career-high 22 points against Maine (Nov. 15) ... Reached double figures 18 times throughout the season ... Delivered a Pac-12 season-high 19 points at Oregon (Jan. 25) ... Went a perfect 9-for-9 from the free throw line in the road win at Oregon (Jan. 25), marking a career best and tying for the second-best single-game mark in the Pac-12 that season ... Ranked fifth in the conference in free throw percentage overall and second during Pac-12 play, converting 54 of 63 attempts (.857) ... Put together streaks of 15 and 16 consecutive free throws made at different points in the year ... Pulled down a season-high nine rebounds on two occasions, most recently vs. Arizona State, adding 16 points and four assists ... Finished the season strong by averaging 12 points and shooting 54% in three postseason games ... Led the Buffaloes in scoring 15 times, including 15 points in the NIT first round vs. St. Bonaventure (Mar. 15).

2022-23 (Junior): Played in 24 games (eight starts) after missing 12 games due to injury ... Averaged 9.3 points (.411 FG%), 2.4 assists and 2.0 rebounds in 26.0 minutes per game ... Had a season-high three steals in the road win over Arizona State (Feb. 4), adding 15 points, five assists and two rebounds ... Scored a season-high 17 points twice against Washington State (Feb. 19 & March 9), including in the Pac-12 Tournament win ... Reached double figures in 11 games ... Posted a season-high eight assists in the NIT game vs. UCF (Mar. 18), and had five games with five or more assists (5–0) ... Recorded at least one steal in 11 games.

2023-24 (Senior): Saw action in 18 games before suffering an injury against Arizona on Jan. 27, which ended his season ... Averaged 7.9 points (.462 FG%), 2.2 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 23.1 minutes per game ... Scored in double figures eight times and recorded five or more assists in four games ... Posted a season-high 17 points vs. Santa Clara (Nov. 24), going 7-of-10 from the field and 3-of-5 from three ... Named to the Emerald Coast Classic All-tournament team ... Helped seal the win at Washington State on (Jan. 6) by making four clutch free throws down the stretch ... Scored 12 points in conference victories over Cal and Arizona State.

2024-25 (Senior): Played all 35 games, averaging 10.0 points (.426 FG%, .414 3P%, .886 FT%), 2.5 assists, 2.3 rebounds and 1.1 steals in 27.8 minutes per game ... Started the final 14 games of the season ... Scored a season-high 22 points in the Players Era Festival championship game (Nov. 30), going 7-of-11 from the field with four assists and two steals against the No. 9-ranked Crimson Tide ... Recorded 18 double-digit scoring games, five outings with five or more assists and 11 games with multiple steals ... Made two or more 3-pointers in 21 games, with a season-high of four 3s on four different occasions ... Ranked 13th in the conference in 3-point percentage and ninth in free throw percentage ... Hit several clutch shots and sparked key runs for the team throughout the season.

Born on Jan. 2, 2001, in Montreal, he is the son of Jerry Barthelemy and Francesca Decopain and has one younger sister, Lyana Rose ... Played AAU basketball with Brookwood Elite in Montreal alongside Quincy Guerrier ... Represented Team Canada at the 2018 FIBA U17 World Cup in Argentina, averaging 5.4 points and 2.1 assists to help Canada finish fourth, posting tournament highs of 10 points and five assists in the quarterfinal win over Australia ... A 2019 graduate of Thornlea Secondary School in Toronto, he earned OSBA Second Team All-Star honors, competed in the 2019 BioSteel All-Canadian Game featuring the country's top 24 players, and participated in the 2019 Basketball Without Borders Camp in Charlotte, N.C., during NBA All-Star Weekend ... Rated a four-star prospect by 247Sports ... Reclassified from 2020 to 2019 and enrolled at Colorado in the fall of 2019, choosing the program for its history of developing guards despite interest from Gonzaga and Arkansas, among others ... Majored in Journalism with a minor in Sports Media at Colorado ... Enjoys music and Haitian food.
