PROFESSIONAL CAREER

Averaged 6.3 points, 3.5 rebounds, 0.7 assists, 0.7 steals, 0.9 blocks and 19.7 minutes across 17 professional games with BK Iskra Svit (Slovakia) and the Montréal Alliance (Canada).

2025: Signed with the Montréal Alliance for the 2025 CEBL season, where he's currently averaging 2.6 points, 1.3 rebounds, 0.9 assists, 0.3 steals, 0.4 blocks, and 8.9 minutes across 7 games ... He was released by the team following the July 9th loss to Calgary and is now being re-signed to join the team for their play-in playoff game against Scarborough on August 14.

2024-25 : Signed professional contract with BK Iskra Svit (Aug. 20)... Averaged 9.9 points, 5.6 rebounds, and 0.5 assists in 30.4 minutes across 10 games... Registered 9 starts... Started in his debut game against Handlova (Sept. 21), recording 14 points, eight rebounds, a season high three steals, and two blocks... Recorded a double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds, along with three blocks against Nextgen (Sep. 25)... Contributed 12 points and eight rebounds against Komarno (Oct. 2)... Scored 10 points, adding two steals and season-high two assists against Blue Wings (Oct. 12)... Grabbed seven rebounds and a season-high four blocks against Handlova (Nov. 9).

UNIVERSITY CAREER

Averaged 9.8 points, 4.8 rebounds, 0.8 assists, 0.6 steals, and 1.0 blocks in 18.0 minutes across 88 games played with MacEwan University (2017-2020) in the Canada West Conference and with the University of Alberta (2021-2023) in the Canada West Conference... Shot 45.4% from the field, 31.0% from the three point line, and 72.5% from the free throw line to score 861 career points, along with 422 rebounds, 67 assists, 52 steals, and 86 blocks in over 1,500 minutes of playing time.

2022-23 (Graduate, Alberta): Culminated his university career with 13.5 points, 6.6 rebounds, and 0.7 assists in 22.0 minutes across 23 games, shooting career-high 51.9% from the field and 69.9% from the free throw line... Started in all 23 appearances... Scored 10 or more points on 14

occasions... Scored 14 points and 4 rebounds in 18 minutes against Manitoba (Nov. 5)... Contributed 13 points and eight rebounds against Calgary (Nov. 11)... Recorded a double-double with 18 points and a season-high 16 rebounds, along with a season-high two blocks, and one steal against Calgary (Nov. 12)... Scored 19 points and six rebounds against Victoria (Nov. 19)... Posted 26 points, shooting 85.7% from the field against UBC (Dec. 2)... Contributed 18 points and eight rebounds against UBC (Jan. 6)... Scored a season-high 27 points and five rebounds in 29 minutes against Trinity Western (Jan. 14)... Played 13 minutes in his debut with Alberta against Lethbridge (Nov. 5), contributing five points, six rebounds, and two blocks... Scored 11 points, four rebounds, one block, and two steals against Mount Royal (Nov. 13)... Grabbed a season-high three steals against Calgary (Nov. 26)... Set season-highs in blocks and assists with three each against Calgary (Nov. 27), along with seven points and nine rebounds in 21 minutes... Led his team with 14 points against MacEwan (Jan. 15)... Led his team with a season-high 20 points and six rebounds against MacEwan (Feb. 11)... Grabbed nine rebounds and eight points in 11 minutes against Lethbridge (Feb. 19)... Scored 11 points, six rebounds, two assists, and tied his season-best three steals in 13 minutes against Calgary (Feb. 27)... Won the U Sports Bronze Medal game against Queen's (Apr. 3), contributing eight points, three rebounds, and one steal.

Shot 40.0% from the field and 76.5% from the free throw line... Started in the season opener against Mount Royal (Nov. 1), contributing 10 points, three rebounds, one steal, and one block... Scored 17 points and a season-high three blocks against Mount Royal (Nov. 2)... Led his team with 14 points against Thompson Rivers (Nov. 15)... Led his team with seven rebounds against Thompson Rivers (Nov. 16)... Led his team with a season-high 31 points, along with five rebounds and three assists against Trinity Western (Nov. 29)... Ranked second in Canada West for most blocks (38)... Ranked fifth in the program's Canada West history for total rebounds in a season

(115)... Ranked seventh in the program's Canada West history for most free throws made in a season (51)... Posted season-high six blocks in the regular season opener against Alberta (Oct. 25), tying the program record for most blocks in a Canada West game... Contributed two assists, six rebounds, four blocks, and a season-high three steals against Lethbridge (Nov. 2)... Grabbed seven rebounds against Lethbridge (Nov. 3)... Led his team with four blocks, along with eight points and six rebounds against Winnipeg (Nov. 9)... Posted a double-double with 15 points and a season-high 13 rebounds against Winnipeg (Nov. 10)... Distributed a season-high four assists against UFV (Nov. 17)... Contributed a double-double consisting of 10 points and 11 rebounds against Regina (Nov. 30)... Scored 17 points and eight rebounds against Regina (Dec. 1)... Named MacEwan's third star of the week (Dec. 4)... Led his team in both categories with 12 points and seven rebounds against Calgary (Jan. 12)... Named MacEwan's second star of the week (Jan. 22)... Awarded the Griffin's Most Improved Player Award.

2017-18 (Freshman, MacEwan) : Started his university career averaging 0.8 games, 0.8 rebounds, and 0.1 assists in 2.3 minutes across 12 games... Registered his university debut playing four minutes against Manitoba (Nov. 10)... Scored his first career points (2) against Manitoba (Nov. 11)... Grabbed a season-best two rebounds on four occasions... Contributed one block against Mount Royal (Jan. 12) and against UBC (Jan. 20).

PERSONAL

He originally played soccer, but wanted to play basketball so he worked as a scorekeeper for the Harry Ainlay High School's team. After learning more about the game and practicing his skills, he started playing basketball for the team at the age of 16 in the 12th grade. Was named Global Edmonton MVP on February 9, 2017, after his first organized basketball game. Went on to play for the MacEwan Griffins after only one year of playing the sport. Previously lived in Kuwait and Nigeria. He participated in the Edmonton Stingers' training camp in 2024 in the CEBL.
