

Catechism in a Year Discussion Groups

Last Week's Highlight:

1189 The liturgical celebration involves signs and symbols relating to creation (candles, water, fire), human life (washing, anointing, breaking bread), and the history of salvation (the rites of the Passover). Integrated into the world of faith and taken up by the power of the Holy Spirit, these cosmic elements, human rituals, and gestures of remembrance of God become bearer of the saving and sanctifying action of Christ.

1191 Song and music are closely connected with the liturgical action. The criteria for their proper use are the beauty expressive of prayer, the unanimous participation of the assembly, and the sacred character of the celebration.

1192 Sacred images in our churches and homes are intended to awaken and nourish our faith in the mystery of Christ. Through the icon of Christ and his works of salvation, it is he whom we adore. Through sacred images of the holy Mother of God, of the angels and of the saints, we venerate the persons represented.

1193 Sunday, the "Lord's Day," is the principal day for the celebration of the Eucharist because it is the day of the Resurrection. It is the pre-eminent day of the liturgical assembly, the day of joy and rest from work. Sunday is "the foundation and kernel of the whole liturgical year"

Help us keep the momentum going as pro-life South Carolinians RALLY on **Saturday**, **June 24**, **the one-year anniversary of the overturning of Roe v. Wade**. We will CELEBRATE our freedom to enact life-saving state laws and we will hear from a great line up of pro-life leaders from around the state. This important event will take place on the State House grounds (North side facing Gervais Street) from 10:00 a.m. until noon. Pro-life organizations will be on hand with information tables so that you can learn more.

Additionally, at the conclusion we will walk across the street to PRAY in front of the SC Supreme Court as they will be meeting three days later on June 27 to hear oral arguments regarding the new SC Heartbeat Law. We will be praying that the justices uphold the Heartbeat Law and immediately remove the hold that has been placed on it. This action will prevent approximately 2/3 of the abortions from happening in our state. In Columbia, this means a reduction to approximately 20 abortions per week instead of 60. We will also pray that this is only the beginning and one day that all abortions will be illegal and unthinkable in South Carolina.






