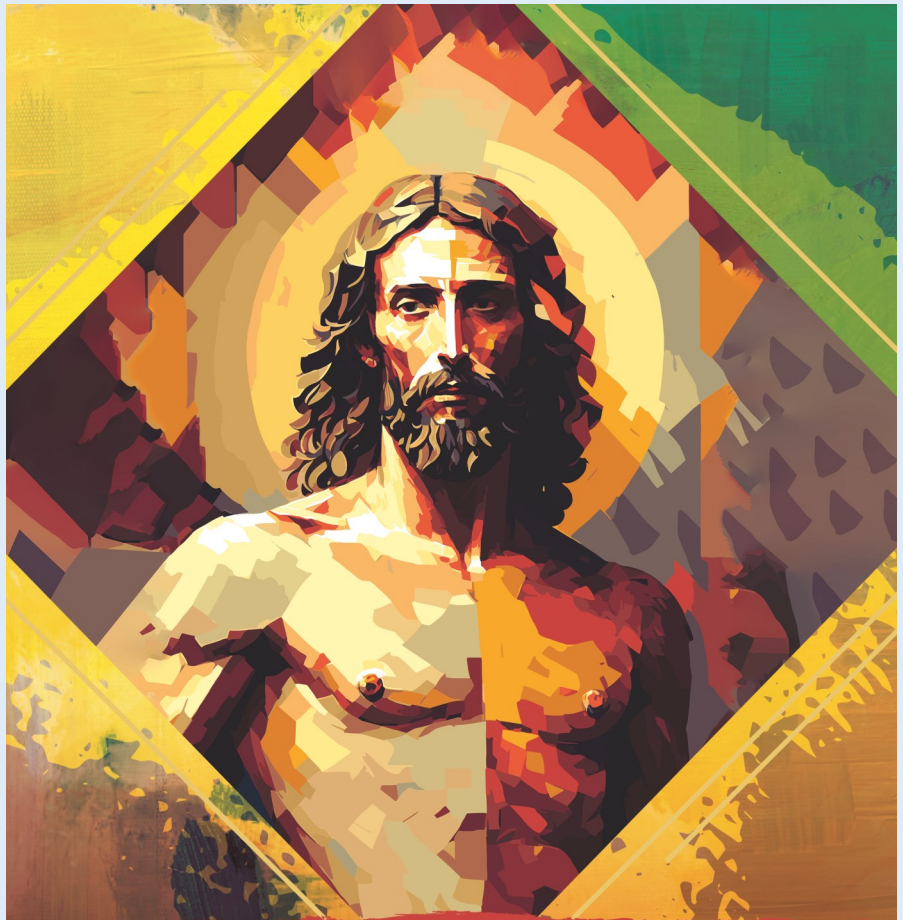

Catechism in a Year Discussion Groups

Last Week's Highlight:

The presence of Christ by the power of his word and the Holy Spirit

1373 "Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us," is present in many ways to his Church: in his word, in his Church's prayer, "where two or three are gathered in my name," in the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, in the sacraments of which he is the author, in the sacrifice of the Mass, and in the person of the minister. But "he is present . . . most especially in the Eucharistic species."

1374 The mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as "the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend." In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist "the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, Really, and substantially contained. This presence is called 'real'--by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present.

Join your fellow parishioners as we read the Catechism and discuss what we are learning. You can jump in at any time. Here are our upcoming meetings:

FISHES & LOAVES OF FAITH FORMATION

- Patty:** Dear Lord in Heaven, I am knocking on your door. I need Volunteers to teach Faith Formation PreK-5. Our Parish is growing, and so is our program. Our needs, therefore, are growing, too. Jesus, please “multiply the Fishes and Loaves (volunteers) of CCD.”
- Volunteer:** I overheard your prayer. I would like to help, but I have a family, a job, and already am so involved in other committees. I just don’t have the time. Good luck finding teachers.
- Patty:** I understand...but are you feeling the nudge from the Holy Spirit? You know the old saying, if you want something done, ask a busy person. I cannot promise you money, but I can promise you a rewarding faith-development experience. As far as time commitment—you would need to teach from 9:00 to 10:15 on Sunday morning, and probably spend 20-60 minutes collaborating with your teaching partner to formulate a lesson plan. **I can help you, and walk you through this.** Jesus had his 12 Apostles, and I need 12 teachers. **I have 8; I only need 4 more.** I am asking for help, as I cannot do this alone. The summer is almost over; time is of the essence.
- Volunteer:** I just don’t know...right now finding a couple of hours a week is asking a lot. I don’t want to short-change my family.
- Patty:** Look at it another way—you are helping your own family grow in faith. You are showing them that the Lord and His Plan/Needs are the center of your family’s Faith. You are demonstrating how joyful it can be to serve the Lord. That being involved in your church is helping spread the Gospel, and strengthening our Catholic community, and helping others—which we are Called to do. You are making your faith a priority and setting a good example for your children.
- Volunteer:** I would like to try. If you are willing to help me, I am willing to teach.
- Patty:** Thank You. Your saying “YES” is a big leap of faith. You are not alone. You will have someone else in the classroom. **I will help you all I can, and God will give you the patience and strength you need. You don’t have to have teaching experience—**just a heart that is willing to expand with love for God and the children. More often than not, by becoming involved in working with the children, you will find you, too, will grow in faith.

REFLECT

In *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, the Supreme Court overturned *Roe v. Wade* and returned the issue of abortion to the people's elected representatives at both the state and federal level. Despite this monumental legal victory, abortion policy is far from settled.

Sadly, over the past year, several states have used this opportunity to not only keep abortion legal, but also to pursue even more extreme pro-abortion policies. Currently, abortion is legal in more states than not. Our dedicated efforts are desperately needed in the months and years to come to protect preborn children and their mothers from the tragedy of abortion.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that we are "*the salt of the earth*" and "*the light of the world*" (Mt. 5:13-14). As Catholics, we have a duty to pursue the common good and to work for the protection of the most vulnerable. Our faith, formed by the teachings of the Church, should guide our engagement in civic life.

Each of us is called to live out our faith publicly, witnessing to the Gospel. For, "*if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot*" (Mt. 5:13). We cannot hide our faith under the "*bushel basket*." Rather, our "*light must shine before others*" (Mt. 5:15-16).

Inspired by the Gospel, we must do what we can to end violence in the womb, to ensure that preborn children are fully protected by our laws, and to support mothers and fathers in welcoming and nurturing their children. May we all faithfully embrace our shared Christian responsibility and be strengthened by God's grace when we encounter resistance or persecution. Together, may we help build a culture of life and civilization of love in our nation.

- Read and meditate on [Matthew 5:1-16](#). Pray for the grace and courage to bring your faith into the public square, working for the protection of all human life.
- Choose one day over this next week to fast from entertainment. Refrain from television, movies, social media, and non-spiritual reading.
- Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for this month's intention.

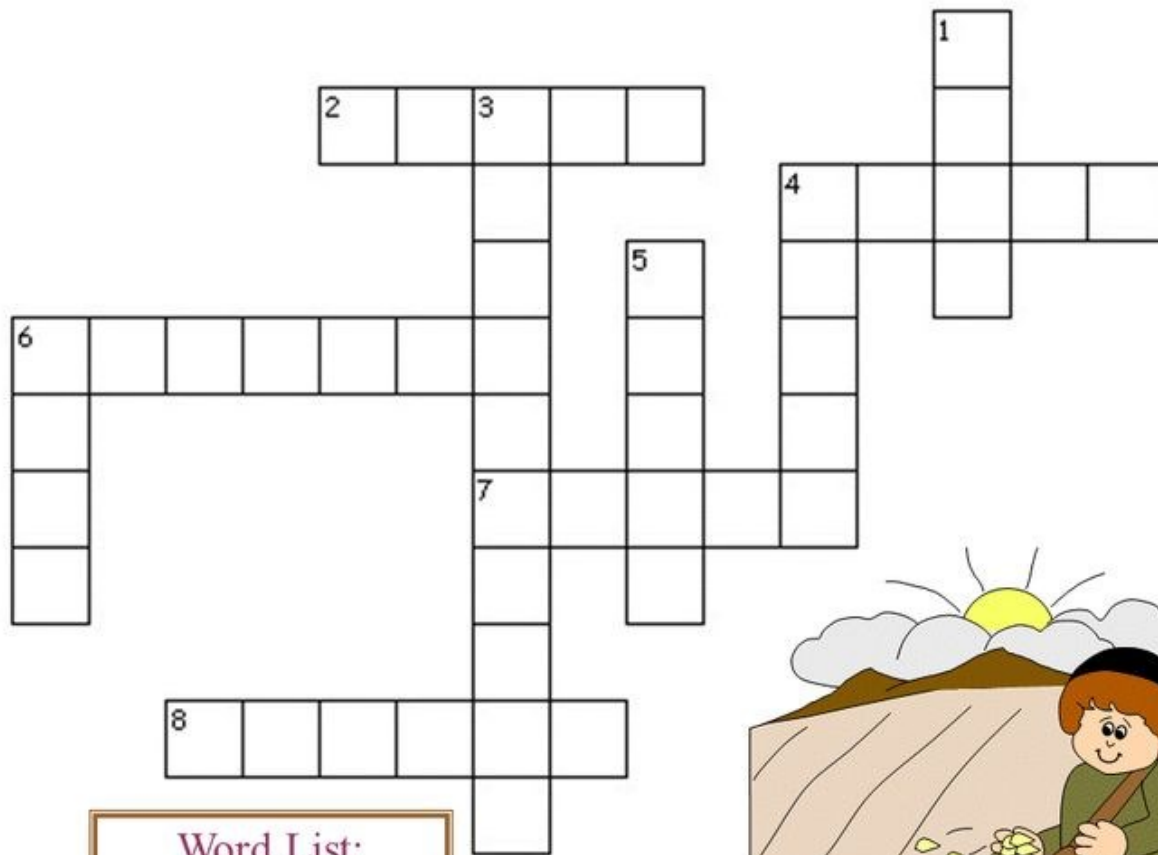
