

Frequently Asked Questions



Dear Transfiguration Catholic Church,

I cannot begin to tell you how grateful I am for Transfiguration Catholic Church. As we reflect on the incredible ten-year journey food Christian Assistance Bridge, it is with immense joy and gratitude that we share this update with you.

Over the past year, our Food Pantry has experienced a remarkable increase of community needs, thanks to our dedicated volunteers' collective efforts and the unwavering support from partners like you. Over half of our clients in 2023 were new, and on average, clients received food three times before they were able to meet their goal of self-sufficiency.

CAB has been able to reach more people facing food insecurity, and we are humbled to make a positive difference in their lives. The heart of our ministry is to empower our most vulnerable families with hope and resources, through the love of Christ.

With Transfiguration's help our food panty was able to give out the following assistance:

- 1. Food Relief: You helped give out over 143,864 pounds of food in 2023. That's over 20,000 pounds more than in 2022.
- 2. Monthly Senior Boxes: We added ten low-income seniors to our monthly food boxes. We now have 54 seniors that we regularly care for every month.
- 3. Emergency Relief Funds: You helped 98 families with more specific tailored needs. These ranged from car repairs so they could continue to work, plumbers to fix the water leak causing their bills to be so high, or beds because they received temporary custody of their grandchildren through DSS and needed help getting their house to meet requirements.
- 4. Utility Assistance: You were able to help 236 families keep their lights and water on. All of these families already had their lights/water cut off or were scheduled to have their services cut off.
- 5. Rent and Mortgage: You helped 64 families with rent or mortgage assistance. A majority of our clients had their rent increase during 2023. These families have been working hard to catch up.
- 6. Housing Support: You helped 18 families with emergency shelter. During 2023, our shelters were filling up quickly. Because of your church's support, we were able to place families in hotels while they waited for their spots at the shelter to open up.


