



This year's seminar—"Defending Dignity: Responding to Human Trafficking and Trauma"—invites healthcare professionals, community leaders and advocates to come together in response to the ongoing crisis of human trafficking.

SC Attorney General Alan Wilson will provide insights into the state's anti-trafficking initiatives, and Dr. Elizabeth Bowman will serve the keynote speaker. A clinically licensed social worker, professor at Gallaudet University, and a survivor of human trafficking, Dr. Bowman is nationally recognized for her expertise in the intersection of trafficking, trauma and vulnerable populations. Our time together will conclude with a dynamic panel discussion featuring local leaders and service providers from the upstate who are working tirelessly to support and restore the lives of trafficking survivors. 
